BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Oh, my, your beautiful "Trimmable Tree" blocks looked great up on the stage at the December Holiday meetings--

they really stood out next to all the orange challenge quilts! Congratulations to Colleen Babcock, who won the 8 trees on Tuesday, and to Carol Ann Keck and Barbara Bledsoe, who won 14 each on Wednesday. Thanks to everyone who entered --and, Tuesday members, are you really letting the Wednesday group get that many more blocks made?

At our January meetings, we'll have the drawings for your "Stained Glass" blocks (the pattern was in last month's newsletter). If you have lots of scraps, especially in 1800's reproduction prints, or other small-scale darks and lights in similar colors, this is an easy way to use them up! This one almost looks like a charm quilt, if you include lots of variety. So gather up those bits and pieces, and cut just squares and rectangles, for a very charming traditional block. You could be a lucky winner this time!

And in this newsletter is the pattern for "Pinwheel Play", the last scrappy block in our set of 12 for the year. Make these with a dark blue background and colorful, bright pinwheels, and bring them to the February meetings. After that, in March we'll start a new set of 12" All Star Blocks, and perhaps we'll add a surprise block now and then, in a different size, just for fun! Stay tuned!

We will be offering our \$5 Block of the Month pattern sets for sale in the Gift Boutique, at the Quilt Fiesta in January. After that, if we have any left, we'll bring them to the meeting in February. Endowment Committee Grant:

The Endowment Committee selected a project grant to partially fund the production costs to create an authentic pattern from the fragile and historically significant Capt. Aust quilt circa 1852, a Baltimore Album Quilt. The grant was submitted by the Baltimore Appliqué Society and written by Marylou McDonald The January 2010 issue of American Quilter has an article, "Tracing History" about a project very similar to the one submitted for funding. Janet Z. Esch explains how Marylou McDonald, Eleanor Layman, and Margo Cramer "... spend hundreds of hours developing consistent and innovative methods to create authentic patterns from priceless antique quilts."

The Tucson Quilters Guild can be very proud of the grant awarded to support their work on the Captain Aust Quilt.



Block of the Month – February 2010 "Pinwheel Play" © 2009 Evelyn George 12 ½ inches unfinished

Here is the last block in this year's set of 12 scrappy Block of the Month designs, and it's so easy, you'll want to make lots of them! Diagonal corner piecing makes the pinwheel in the center of each block, and when the blocks are joined in a quilt, more pinwheels magically appear at the corners where four triangles come together!

COLORS

Use medium or dark blue for the background color. Choose two or more light or bright colors for the pinwheels. (You can use a variety of colors to make scrappy pinwheels--but cut all the background pieces from the same fabric, for the best effect.)



CUTTING


8 3 1/2" squares in bright colors

8 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles of dark blue


TRIANGLE STRIPS

(The triangle shapes are formed from the squares and rectangles, using a diagonal corner piecing method.)
Draw a diagonal line on the **wrong side** of each 3 ½" square.
Place a square on top of the **right hand end** of a 3 ½" x 6 ½" blue rectangle, **right sides together**:

Check to be sure the line goes diagonally across the upper right corner, as illustrated, right. This angle ensures that the center pinwheel will go in the correct direction, and that more pinwheels will be formed when the blocks are sewn together into a quilt. Stitch on the drawn line, through both fabrics. Trim off the corner, leaving 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam allowance toward the corner. This is a Triangle Strip. Repeat to make 8 Triangle (T Strips, making sure the angles are the same on all of them.







TRIANGLE STRIP (make 8)
(The triangles can be assorted colors)

DOUBLE TRIANGLE UNITS

Position two Triangle Strips together side by side, with the triangles facing each other but at opposite ends of their strips, as shown in the illustration at right. → The tips of the two triangles should just meet in the center of the unit, after the seam is sewn. To get them to meet nicely, pin ¼" from the edge through both seam allowances at the point where the two triangles should meet. Stitch together. The resulting Double Triangle Unit should measure 6 ½" x 6 ½". Make 4 Double Triangle Units, for the 4 quarters of the block.







DOUBLE TRIANGLE UNIT (make 4)

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

Arrange the 4 Double Triangle Units as shown at right. **Note that each unit is turned in a different direction.**(Unit seams are going horizontally in the upper left and lower right quarters, and vertically in the lower left and upper right.) When units are correctly positioned, you will see a pinwheel in the center of the block, and a single triangle in each corner. Pin and stitch the 4 parts together like a 4-patch, to make the "Pinwheel Play" block, as shown at top of page.
