#### June: Introducing the New Categories

You are thinking about that quilt already, aren't you? It's time to pull out your inspiration and begin planning a design if you haven't already done so. Get going!!! The Quilt Show packets and entry forms are ready. For those who cannot print forms off the website, copies will be available at Guild general meetings from June – September

Where will your quilt entry/entries belong? Here's a peek at the Quilt Show categories for 2011 which are similar to those in years past but with new category names and descriptions. All quilts in groups A (more than one person's work) and B (only one person's work) may be submitted as JUDGED or NON-JUDGED. It's really your call. If you'd like to receive written feedback from the judges designed to help you improve your quilting skills, your entry form must be marked JUDGED and you must include a \$5 per quilt judging fee. You can read more about the judging process in the months to come. Group C entries are submitted for display and are not judged. Quilts in ALL categories are eligible for the Viewer's Choice ribbons. *Categories may be combined or subdivided based upon the number of entries received.* You'll also find this information in the Quilt Show packets. If you have any questions, you can contact Judging co-chairs Nancy Arseneault and Lois Podolny.

**New in 2011:** in order to recognize the importance of the professional quilter to our work, ribbons will be awarded to those who quilted the first place winners in Group A. Also new will be the recognition of originality of design: defined as "drawn or drafted by the maker and NOT based upon an existing quilt or another artist's interpretation of the same subject matter."

As quilt makers, we love to see what everyone is doing. Whether you make large or small quilts, pieced or appliquéd quilts, traditional or art quilts, please enter the show and share your work with others!

#### **Admission Fee for Members**

We will now charge \$5.00 per day to enter the quilt show if a member is not working for a quilt show committee, or taking a hostess shift. If you work one day and then attend the show the following day you will be charged \$5.00. You will need to show a current membership card to receive the discounted \$5.00 ticket.



#### Block of the Month

We had a lovely bunch of breezy "Windmill Star" blocks on display for your drawings at the May meetings! Congratulations to our lucky winners, Amy Kemper, who won 10 blocks on Tuesday, and Kathy Hansen, who won 16 on Wednesday. Thanks very much to everyone who entered their beautiful blocks!

At the June meetings, we'll have the drawings for your "Diamond Frame Star" blocks. Find the pattern in last month's newsletter, and make a block (or several), in your choice of colors--they're fun and easy, with our rotary cutting and quick piecing directions. (You can "frame" a special motif in the center of the star, if you wish. Just cut the center square as usual, on the straight of grain, with the motif centered. Then, magically, after the 4 corner triangles are added, the motif appears to be on point, inside a diamond shaped frame!) For best results, remember to trim and square up the pieced units to size, as described on the pattern page --this is most easily done with a 4 1/2" square-up ruler, if you have one -- it's the perfect size, and has a diagonal line going from corner to corner, to help you line up those diagonal seams.

In this issue of the newsletter you'll find the pattern for "Star Within a Star" for our July drawings. We'll have those drawings at our special "First Quilt, Last Quilt" presentation at the July meetings. What better theme for the month of July than patriotic colors? You can make the small and large stars from the same fabric, or use 2 different colors. These will be glorious, so be sure to make some.

If your summer plans will take you away from Tucson, you can still enter the drawings, by mailing your blocks to Evelyn George, 3361 N. Winstel Blvd., Tucson, AZ 85716. They must arrive at least one day before the drawing, in order to be entered. Please include your email or phone number so we can notify you if you win!



# Block of the Month - July 2010 "Star Within A Star" (unfinished size 12½")

Hooray for the Red, White and Blue! This variation of the classic Sawtooth Star has a 6 inch star as the center of the twelve inch star. Make the block in bright patriotic colors. The two stars may be different colors -- for example, one red and the other blue, or two shades of the same color, such as light and dark blue. Starry prints are appropriate! The background fabric could be white, or a small red and/or blue print on white.



#### Cutting:

Small Star – Cut eight 2" squares Large Star – Cut eight 3½" squares

Background - Cut five 31/2" squares and four 2" squares;


also four 31/2" x 61/2" rectangles, and four 2" x 31/2" rectangles

(If you wish, one of the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " background squares may be of a different fabric, to go in the center of the Small Star.)

The star points on both stars are formed by Flying Geese Units.

#### Flying Geese Units (for Small Star):

Use the four 2" x 3½" background rectangles and the eight 2" squares of your **Small Star** color (red or blue). For this illustration, we used blue. Line up a 2" blue square on top of one end of a 2" x 3½" background rectangle, with *right sides together*. Stitch diagonally across the blue square from corner to corner, at the angle shown (you can draw the line first, if that is helpful). Trim off the outer corner, leaving a ½" seam allowance. Press the seam toward the corner. Pressing is indicated by arrows. Next, place another blue square on the other end of the background rectangle. Stitch at the angle shown. Trim and press. This makes one small Flying Geese Unit.




Flying Geese Unit

Make 4 small Flying Geese Units for the Small Star.

#### Small Star:

Arrange the four small **Flying Geese Units** on the four sides of the 3½" **Center square**, and place the four 2" background squares at the outer corners of the block.

The **Flying Geese Units** should be positioned so they form the star points. When they are correctly positioned, sew the units together into three rows → then sew rows together to make the **Small Star**. Press toward plain squares.




#### Flying Geese Units (for Large Star):


Use the four  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " background rectangles and the eight  $3\frac{1}{2}$ "" squares of your **Large Star** color (red or blue). Follow the same directions you used above.

Make 4 large Flying Geese Units for the Large Star.

#### Finish the Block:

The **Small Star** becomes the center square of the **Large Star**. Arrange the four large **Flying Geese Units** around the **Small Star** and place the four 3½" background squares at the outer corners of the block. Sew together into 3 rows, then sew rows together to make the Large Star. Now you have a **Star Within A Star!**
