PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The summer heat is upon those of us who live in Tucson year round. I hope you are all working hard on your projects in the cool of the A/C's!

I was shopping for groceries when a woman stopped me and said, 'You're with the Quilt Guild, right?'. She is our liaison for the Kidney Foundation and Desert Dialysis. She told me some stories of how our Cases for Kids project touched the lives of some of the patients who attended the camp for children with cancer, and how the small quilts are used while someone is receiving dialysis.

These types of stories are the ones which warm my heart. The stories of how one item may bring some joy to the life of a person who has nothing at all, or how a bright pillowcase helped calm a child who may not have many bright days left. I know we often just drop off the quilts/cases/pillows or bears to the back table, but eventually they will have a wonderful story to tell. The bear you dressed might be the one a frightened child will grasp when being taken away from a horrible situation. The pillowcase you made might be the one a child will focus on when all they are surrounded with is the sterile white walls of an isolation room. That quilt you made might be the one that is wrapped around a man who has no family to comfort him when his memory fades away. Our hands may make the items we give, but eventually it's the love we secretly hide in them that comes out and touches a life.

At the June TQG Business meeting, the Finance Committee presented recommendations for price increases which were approved by the Board. The visitor fee for meetings with a speaker will be increased to \$5, effective September 2010. Beginning in February 2011, workshops will be \$50 for members; non-members will pay \$25 more than members (i.e., \$75). It was also recommending that membership dues for the next membership year (March 1, 2011 to February 28, 2012) be increased to \$30 with an additional fee for those who want their newsletter mailed to them. Judging: Included here is an except from Nancy Arseneault's monthly series of articles about judging. The complete article is available on the guild's website: http://tucsonquiltersguild.com.

July: FIRST IMPRESSIONS. This article includes some advice on good design for show quilts as well as information on how to make sure your quilt has VISUAL IMPACT...one of the things the judges will evaluate. An except follows:

".... the judges have very little time to study and appreciate all the hard work we've invested in our quilt's design and construction. In the course of two days, the judges will provide written feedback on as many as 230 quilts. Approximately 80 of those quilts will receive ribbons. Are all quilts wonderful? In my book, the answer is yes, whether they win prizes or not. Our quilts, both traditional and original, express our feelings. Even better, the complexity of our craft allows us unlimited potential to challenge ourselves and to grow. We learn valuable lessons from each project that we complete...we even learn important lessons from the quilts we do **not** complete."

Use up some of your patriotic fabrics and colors for these blocks---and you might be the lucky winner of enough to make a very pretty quilt!

And in this newsletter, look for the pattern for "Harlequin Star" for our August drawings. It's very playful, in bright colors! Quilters S.O.S. - Save Our Stories Launched

Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame is pleased to announce that we have posted our first interview in the Quilters S.O.S. - Save Our Stories Project. Evelyn George, Tucson, Class of 2008, pictured here, is our first interviewee.

The Quilters S.O.S. - Save Our Stories Project is conducted in partnership with The Alliance for American Quilts and strives to capture the stories of living quiltmakers. Volunteers interview quilters. Those interviews are captured on tape and transcribed. The interviews and transcriptions are housed with the Alliance and the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress. Interviews are used for academic research, by guilds seeking more information about potential teachers, collectors considering quilt purchases, and more.


It is the goal of the Hall of Fame to conduct interviews with all of our living inductees, as well as any other interesting or interested quiltmakers. You can recommend a quiltmaker, or yourself, for this project by contacting the Hall of Fame. Block of the Month - August 2010 © 2010 Evelyn George "Harlequin Star" (unfinished size 121/2")

This 6th block in our Starry Sampler brings us half way through the year's set. Let this playful, bright-colored star tumble across your quilt like a clown performing tricks! It's very easy to cut and sew -- just pay attention to the angles! It's quick, too--you'll have a bunch of them made in practically no time. Our Star Points are watermelon pink and yellow, on turquoise. You might try combinations like orange and blue, purple and lime green, red and black, etc. Use a blue (or other contrasting bright) for the background. Polka dots would be fun!



Cutting:

Background – Cut four 4½" x 4½" and eight 2½" x 2½" squares
Each of your 2 Star Colors – Cut four 2½" x 4½" rectangles and two 2½" x 2½" squares

<u>Star Points</u>: Diagonal corner piecing is used to make these <u>mirror image</u> star points.

Begin by dividing the Star Color rectangles into 2 piles, so that each pile contains 2 rectangles of each Star Color.

Starting with one of the piles, place a background square on top of the <u>right hand end</u> of each rectangle (2 of each Star Color), with right sides together, and stitch diagonally across the square, <u>at the angle shown</u> in the illustration to the right.

(You can draw the diagonal line first if you wish.)

Trim off the corner, leaving a '4" seam allowance.

Press seam allowance toward the corner, in this first group:

Make 2 Star Points of each color, stitched at this first angle.

Using the second pile, again place a background square on the <u>right hand end</u> of each rectangle, right sides together, as before, but this time <u>stitch at the opposite angle</u>. Trim, and press the seam allowance <u>away from the corner</u>, in this second group: → Make 2 Star Points of each color (mirror images of the first group). (Keep the two piles separate.)

Quarter-Block Units:

For each Quarter-Block Unit, use 2 Star Points of the <u>same</u> color, but select one from each group (sewn at opposite angles).


Also use one 4½" background square and a 2½" square of your <u>other</u> Star Color. <u>Arrange these pieces in the positions shown</u> and stitch together into 2 rows. Press seams toward plain squares. Then stitch rows together. Press row seam toward the row that has the large square. Pressing is the same for all 4 Units, and is shown by the arrows. Make 2 <u>Quarter-Block Units</u> with Star Points of one color, and 2 with Star Points of the other color (total of 4).

To Assemble the Block:


Arrange the 4 Quarter-Block Units to match the block illustration at top of page. Pin where seams need to match, and stitch them together like a 4-Patch, to make the "Harlequin Star".

Note the checkerboard effect, with a small 4-patch that appears in the center of the finished block.


Star Points:




Make 2 from each Star Color, at angle above



Make 2 more from each Star Color. at mirror images of first angle



Make 4 Quarter-Block Units, 2 from each Star Point Color
