Block of the Month

At our July meetings, we had the drawings for your pretty red, white and blue "Star within a Star" blocks. Karen Fuller won 9 on Tuesday and Joyce O'Connor won 9 on Wednesday --congratulations, ladies!

At our August meetings, we'll have the drawings for your "Harlequin Star" blocks. The pattern was in last month's newsletter. This is a playful block, using your bright scraps, so be sure to make one (or a bunch) for August--you might be a lucky winner! We'll have the drawings during our lunch break at the Quilt-a-thon meetings (Block of the Month display will be on the stage, since all the tables will be in use for the Quilt-a-thon).

And in this newsletter is the pattern for "Road to Santa Fe", a beautiful star block in turquoise, lapis blue and gold-reminiscent of some of the jewelry made in Santa Fe. When the blocks are set together, the turquoise "stones" form a series of paths crossing the quilt (or the Plaza, if you stretch your imagination). They do the same thing even when used as an alternate block, and make a really lovely design. So be sure to make this one and enter the September drawing, because the lucky winner will have lots of ways to use the blocks!

Hope you're quilting someplace cool, and even if that doesn't happen to be in Tucson, you can still mail your August entries to Evelyn George, 3361 N. Winstel Blvd., Tucson, AZ 85716. Be sure to say which day you want them entered, and your lucky number, which we'll honor if it's available. Entries must arrive at least one day before the drawing to be eligible to win. (One of our July winners, Joyce, mailed hers in!)

(If you're interested in having measurements for cutting any of this year's star blocks in a 6 inch size, contact Kay Hendricks, and she can e-mail them to you.)

BY-LAW CHANGES

New members may now submit their applications at the annual Quilt Fiesta in January. The Membership Director has to have the packets to

the printers before the January meeting. If a change in membership dues is approved in January, it's too late for the Quilt Show new member packets. Because of this we are recommending the following change to our By-Laws:

ARTICLE III: DUES

Section 1: Annual dues will be required of each member payable at or before the March general meeting. The amount of dues will be decided *on or before October (upon each January)* at the general meeting (s) and will not be pro-rated for members throughout the year. New members may submit membership applications with dues for the forthcoming year at the annual Quilt Fiesta in January.

This change in the By-Laws will be voted on at the September general meetings, Marie Morris

At the June TQG Business meeting, the Finance Committee presented recommendations for price increases which were approved by the Board. The visitor fee for meetings with a speaker will be increased to \$5, effective September 2010. Beginning in February 2011, workshops will be \$50 for members; non-members will pay \$25 more than members (i.e., \$75). It was also recommending that membership dues for the next membership year (March 1, 2011 to February 28, 2012) be increased to \$30 with an additional fee for those who want their newsletter mailed to them. The dues increase will require a vote of the membership. You will hear more about this in September. TQG Finance Committee.



Block of the Month -September 2010 © 2010 Evelyn George "Road to Santa Fe" (unfinished size 121/2")

We begin the second half of our Starry Sampler set with this very versatile star block. It is presented here with a Southwestern look, in turquoise and lapis blue on a crisp white background, with a gold star in the center. When these blocks are set in a quilt, use a little imagination and you can see the turquoise trails, crossing the Santa Fe Plaza! Strip piecing helps make the corner units, and the star points are made with flying geese methods. There are no triangles to cut out-only strips and squares. This block makes an exciting quilt, and can also be used as an interesting alternate block with our other stars.



Cutting: (*WOF = width of fabric, or 42")

White: Cut 2 strips 2" x WOF*; from them, cut one 18" length and twelve 2" x 31/2" rectangles.

Turquoise: Cut 1 strip 2" x WOF; from it cut one 18" length and four 2" squares.

Also from turquoise, cut one 31/2" square.

Lapis Blue: Cut 1 strip 2" x 18"; from it cut eight 2" squares; also cut four 31/2" squares.

Cut 1 strip 2" x 18"; from it cut eight 2" squares. Gold:

--Use ¼" seam allowances.

←make 4

Corner Units:

Stitch the 18" white strip and 18" turquoise strips together side by side. Press toward turquoise. Cut crosswise into 2" sections (need 8). Stitch two 2" sections together, with colors alternating as shown, >

to make a 4-patch. Make four 4-patches.

Stitch a 2" x 31/2" white rectangle to the right hand edge of each 4-patch.

Position the turquoise squares as shown, so they will make a diagonal chain.

Stitch a 2" turquoise square to one end of each remaining 2" x 31/2" white rectangle; stitch this pieced combination onto the lower edge of each unit, to make 4 identical Corner Units. >

Blue (outer) Star Points: Using the remaining four 2" x 31/2" white rectangles and eight 2" lapis blue squares, make flying geese, as follows: Line up a blue square on top of one end of a white rectangle, with right sides together. Stitch diagonally across the blue square from corner to corner, at the angle shown (you can draw the line first, if that is helpful). Trim off the outer corner, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam toward the corner. Pressing is indicated by arrows. Next, place another blue square on the other end of the white rectangle. Stitch at the angle shown. Trim and press. Make 4 flying geese units; each has 2 blue star points.









←make 4 (Blue Star Points)

Gold (inner) Star Points:

This time, using the four 31/2" lapis blue squares and the eight 2" gold squares, stitch two gold squares to one edge of each blue square in the same manner as you did for the flying geese (above). Make 4; each has 2 gold star points.



←make 4 (Gold Star Points)

Star Point Units:

Stitch each flying geese unit (with blue star points) to the lower edge of a square (with gold star points), so that blue fabric is touching blue fabric, to make a Star Point Unit. Make 4.






←make 4 Star **Point Units**

Assemble the Block:

Arrange the 4 Star Point Units around the 4 sides of the single 3½" turquoise square, with star points pointing away from center. Position the 4 Corner Units so all turquoise squares form an "X" going diagonally through the center of the block. (Note also that the 2 white rectangles in each Corner Unit are positioned next to the sides of the Star Point Units.) When all units are arranged so they match the illustration at top of page, stitch them together in 3 rows, pinning where seams need to match, then stitch rows together to make the block.
