Sue's major awards include 1998 AQS Best of Show for "The Beatles Quilt" made by Sue and her sister, Pat Holly. Their quilt, "The Space Quilt" won the 2003 IQA Master of Machine Artistry Award and the 2004 AQS Machine Workmanship Award. Sue's current books are "Machine Quilting: A Primer of Techniques" and "Stitched Raw Edge Appliqué" co-authored with Pat. Sue has

also been a judge for many quilt shows, most recently part of the team judging the 2009 IQA Show. Sue's priority in the workshops she teaches is to provide a relaxed environment for students to learn machine techniques that are timesaving. Sue emphasizes the best quality workmanship, never compromising quality for speed!




Block of the Month

Congratulations to the winners of the stunning purple, turquoise and gold "Arrowhead Nine-Patch" blocks at the October meetings! Marie Kozlowski (Tuesday) and Gayle Brown (Wednesday) each took home 10 beautiful blocks--have fun using them, ladies!

At our meetings in November we'll have the drawings for your 'Homecoming Star" blocks, so be sure to make some in rich Fall colors and bring them to enter. You could be a lucky winner, just in time to make a cozy quilt for yourself or someone special! The pattern was in the October newsletter.

And in this newsletter, look for the pattern for the "Christmas Star" block for our December drawings. Make these in traditional green, red and cream holiday prints of your choice. The star points make a wreath-like shape around a plain center square or fussy cut motif. These pretty blocks can stand alone, but they also combine well with other Christmas blocks --so make some for the December drawings --you might win a bunch and be well on the way to making that Christmas quilt!

We have free copies of the current patterns, plus annual Block of the Month pattern sets from the past 8 years (only \$5 per set, with color covers). UP COMING VOTES

TO BE VOTED ON AT THE NOVEMBER MEETINGS:

Amendment to Article VIII, Section 4:

- Currently reads: At the January General Meeting nominations will be taken from the floor for the two Members-at-Large positions. At the February General Meeting additional nominations may be taken and a paper ballot election will be held for those two positions.
- Changed to: At the January General Meeting, in odd numbered years, nominations will be taken from the floor at the night General Meeting, for one Member-at-Large position to represent the night membership. At the January General Meeting, in even numbered years, nominations will be taken from the floor at the day General Meeting, for one Member-at-Large position to represent the day membership. At the February General Meeting, additional nominations may be taken (for the appropriate year) and a paper ballot election will be held for the vacant position.

Block of the Month - December 2010 "Christmas Star" (unfinished size 121/2")

Here's a pretty wreath-like star for the Holidays! We like it in red and green, with a cream colored background. Solid appearing backgrounds and smaller scale prints work well. This block is easier than it looks! Use our quick-piecing shortcuts, and remember to square up the slightly oversized triangle units to just the perfect size, and they'll go together with ease. If you like, switch the positions of the red and green, or use additional fabrics for a scrappier look.



Cutting:

Green – two 5½" squares and four 3" squares Red – one 5½" square and four 2½" squares Cream – one 51/2" square, one 41/2" square, four 3" squares and four 21/2" squares

Quarter-Square Triangle Units:

Use the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (2 green, and 1 each red and cream).

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the 5½" square of Cream fabric; place it on top of a 5½" square of Green fabric, right sides together. Stitch 1/4" away from the line, on **both sides** of the line. Cut apart on the drawn line; open up and press seams toward the green. Similarly, draw a line on wrong side of the 5½" square of **Red** fabric and place it **right sides together** on the other square of *Green* fabric. Stitch, cut apart, and again press toward the green. Now place each Cream/Green square on top of a Red/Green square, right sides together \ with the *Cream* triangle in the *upper* layer positioned over the *Green* triangle in the *lower* layer (and the upper green triangle will be over the

lower red triangle). Nestle the seams snugly together and draw a diagonal line across each upper square, from corner to corner, crossing the previous seam allowance at a right angle. Stitch 1/4" away from the drawn line, on **both sides** of line. Cut apart on drawn line. Press open. This makes 4 Quarter-Square Triangle Units.





Quarter Square **Triangle Units** 1

These Quarter-Square Triangle Units are slightly oversized: Use a square-up ruler with a diagonal line on it to trim them to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square, aligning the diagonal seams from corner to corner in both directions.

Half-Square Triangles: Use the 4 green and 4 cream 3" squares.

On the wrong side of each 3" cream square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place each on top of a 3" green square, right sides together, and stitch 1/4" away from the line, on both sides of the line. Cut apart on drawn line; open and press seams toward green.







Makes 8 Half-Square Triangles

These are slightly oversized; square them up to 2½" before continuing.


Corner Units:

Arrange two of the green/cream half-square triangles with 1 red and 1 cream 21/2" square as shown, right, and stitch together to make a Corner Unit. Make 4 identical Corner Units:



Block Construction:

First, arrange the 4 Quarter-Square Triangle Units around the 4 sides of the 4½" cream square, rotating them so the red triangles are next to the center square of cream fabric, and the cream (background) triangles are at the outside edges of the block. Next, position the 4 Corner Units so their cream squares are at the outer corners of the block. (The star points are formed by the large and small green triangles, as shown in the block illustration at top of page.) Finally, when all parts are correctly positioned to form the star, stitch them together into 3 rows, then stitch rows together to make the block.
