

It's time for the Holiday Block Exchange! All members are encouraged to join in the fun and share your magnificent creation. Simply complete your 12 1/2 inches X 12 1/2 inches unfinished block. Just the top, no batting or backing. On the back of your block, attach a piece of muslin marked with:

Wrap your block around a paper towel roll (this keeps it smooth). Use any holiday paper to wrap it up and ribbon to tie it up. Wrapped blocks will be collected and then redistributed to those who brought a block. Open and sign the block. Holiday Block Helpers will again pick up the blocks and hang for voting. Ballots will be available for you to choose your favorite. There will be three chosen from each meeting. These winning blocks will be displayed at the guild meeting in January and voted on again. Then they will be hung at the quilt show. Non-winning blocks can be taken home following the Party. Please join us for this fun and creative activity!

FOR ALL THOSE WHO HAVE ENTERED QUILTS into the 2011 Quilt Fiesta, please take the time to read Nancy Arseneault's web article on readying your show quilt. The entire series of articles can be accessed on the home page of the Guild website below the photo of the raffle quilt & under the heading 2011 Quilt Fiesta Entry and Judging Process for Show Quilts.

For the first time in 2011, quilts which do not meet the show's entry requirements will be not be accepted. The December article clarifies the submission instructions. Nancy explains how to make a competition hanging sleeve and offers tips on how to remove lint and odors from your quilt. You'll also learn why the Guild requires all quilts to be submitted in a appropriately sized pillowcase or quilt bag,

PLEASE NOTE: IF YOU HAVE ENTERED AN ART QUILT THAT CANNOT BE FOLDED DUE TO SURFACE TREAT-MENTS OR EMBELLISHMENTS, YOU'LL NEED TO OBTAIN ADVANCE PERMISSION TO SUBMIT YOUR QUILT ROLLED ON A TUBE. Contact Judging Co-chairs Lois Podolny or Nancy Arseneault BEFORE JANUARY 11TH to register your entry for special handling and for information on acceptable packaging for rolled quilts.

Block of the Month

At our November meetings, your pretty Homecoming Stars were on display to greet all our members (and welcome many of you back "home" for the holidays). Congratulations to our winners, Anne Berry who won 8 on Tuesday and Laura Cotter, who won 9 on Wednesday!

In December, at our annual Holiday Celebration meetings, we'll have lots of fun things to do, including Block of the Month! We'll have the drawings for your "Wreath Star" blocks (the pattern was in last month's newsletter). So gather up your red, green and cream Christmas fabrics and make a block or two to enter in December--you might win a bunch!

And in this newsletter you'll find the pattern for "Best Friends Star" for the January drawings. It features black and white prints and bright colors, and it's designed especially to make two mirror image stars--one for you and one for your best friend, or enter them both in the Block of the Month drawing!

We'll have free copies of the current star patterns available for you at the meetings, so if you've missed any, feel free to come and pick them up, while supplies last. February will end our current membership year and the set of 12 star patterns will be complete; at that time we'll make up some sets with color covers, and have them available for \$5 per set. Meanwhile, we plan to have all 8 Block of the Month sets available for sale at the quilt show in January. So we'll be sharing the fun, and helping to offset the cost of making the patterns for you every month. And we're already thinking about what our next set will be, so if you have any ideas or suggestions, please let us know?






PRESIDENT THANK YOU BLOCK

It's time to begin working on our 'Thank You' blocks for our Guild President, Kathy Harris. Here's the pattern. The block should measure 6½" when you finish it. Kathy loves orange so we will use orange fabric for the 6½" block and white for the corner triangles. The blocks can be turned in at the January and February meetings.

- 1) Cut an orange 6½" square block.
- 2) Cut 2 white 3½" square blocks. Mark the diagonal of these blocks.
- Right sides together, layer the white blocks on opposite corners of the orange block and stitch on the diagonal.Figure A
- 4) Press the triangle up. Figure B








Block of the Month - January 2011 "Best Friends Star" (unfinished size 12½")

The 11th block in our starry set is a perfect one to exchange with guilting friends because directions are given for making two at a time! There's a good reason for that—our quick piecing technique produces 4 star points; however, 2 of them spin to the left and 2 to the right! But, if





you make 2 blocks at a time, you'll get 4 of each kind of star point! Pick your friend's favorite bright color (or yours), plus two black-and-white (B&W) prints: choose one that is mostly white, and another that is mostly black. Then add a plain white, and you're ready to make 2 beautiful stars, almost the same but not quite—Like best friends, they have a lot in common, but each has her own personality!

Cutting (Measure carefully—note that you'll be cutting 3 different sizes of squares!)

One 21/2"x WOF* strip each of plain white, and of the mostly white B&W print (for the 4-patches)

Two 4½" squares of the mostly white B&W print (center squares for two blocks)

Four 5" squares of one bright color

Two 5½" squares of plain white


Two 5½" squares of the mostly black B&W print

*WOF = approx. 21"- 22"

4-Patches: Stitch the 2½" x WOF strips (plain white and mostly white B&W print), right sides together, to make a long pieced strip. Press seam allowance toward the print. Measure and cut the strip into 21/2" sections

(need 16). Arrange the sections into pairs, with colors opposing, and stitch together to make 4-Patches.





Star Point Units:

First make half-square triangles with all the 5½" squares (2 plain white and 2 mostly black B&W print):

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on **wrong side** of a 5½" white square; place on top of a 5½" square of mostly black fabric, *right sides together*. Stitch 1/4" away from the line, on **both sides** of the line. Cut apart on drawn line; open up and press seams toward the dark; repeat to make a total of 4 half-square triangles.







Next, draw a line on wrong side of each 5" square of your bright color fabric and place each on top of one of the half-square triangles, right sides together, with the drawn line going across the previous seam allowance at a right angle → Stitch 1/4" away from the drawn line, on both sides of the line, cut apart, and press toward the bright.

This makes a total of 8 Star Point Units. Note: These are slightly oversized: Use a square-up ruler with a diagonal line on it to trim them to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square, aligning the diagonal seams so they come exactly to the corners of the square.








Carefully separate them into two groups: 4 with their bright star points leaning left ↑ + 4 leaning right ↑

Block Construction:

First, arrange 4 Star Point Units (having the same rotation, either left or right) around the 4 sides of each 4½" center square, rotating them so the bright triangles are next to the center square, and the smaller black triangles form a smaller star point next to the big bright one. Make sure that each block has 4 identical star points; one star should be the mirror image of the other (study the illustrations, top of page). Next, position the 4-Patches at the 4 corners of each block so their darker squares are at the outer corners of the block, forming a diagonal chain with the center square, in both directions. Finally, when all parts are correctly positioned to form the stars, stitch each block together into 3 rows, then stitch rows together to make the blocks. Give one to your best friend and keep one for yourself—or enter them both in the Block of the Month drawing!
