

Update on the Girl Scout Project An excerpt from a letter received by the Sahuaro Girl Scout Council office in 2009: "Thank you for posting your Quilt It badge online for all of us to share. I have 3 daughters in Girl Scouts and two of their troops earned the badges. We not only learned from another leader about quilting, we made our own and one large troop quilt to donate. The area quilt show we attended had an area that you could donate quilts to the battered women's shelter for the children that come through. I know that this badge has gotten several families (including my own) into quilting. One of my troops made a quilt for a classmate whose home had recently burned. G.S. leader Troops 1844, 320, and 1297"

WOW! Not only have the years gone by but the Quilt It badge series developed by the Education Committee is continuing to touch the lives of many Girl Scouts. Since the beginning of the Girl Scout Project to the official recognition of the Brownie Try It and the Junior Merit Badge in January 2007 to the addition of the Cadette/Senior Interest Patch in 2008, 442 Brownie Try Its, 292 Junior Merit Badges, and 133 Cadette/Senior Interest Patches have been purchased through the Sahuaro Girl Scout Council. I am no longer able to get a tally by state from the Council Office.

FOR ALL THOSE WHO HAVE ENTERED QUILTS into the 2011 Quilt Fiesta, please take the time to read Nancy Arseneault's web article on readying your show quilt. The entire series of articles can be accessed on the home page of the Guild website below the photo of the raffle quilt & under the heading 2011 Quilt Fiesta Entry and Judging Process for Show Quilts.

For the first time in 2011, quilts which do not meet the show's entry requirements will be not be accepted. The December article clarifies the submission instructions. Nancy explains how to make a competition hanging sleeve and offers tips on how to remove lint and odors from your quilt. You'll also learn why the Guild requires all quilts to be submitted in a appropriately sized pillowcase or quilt bag,

Contact Judging Co-chairs Lois Podolny or Nancy Arseneault BEFORE JANUARY 11TH to register your entry for special handling and for information on acceptable packaging for rolled quilts.

QUILT SHOP OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS SOUGHT: PHOENIX, AZ... The independently-owned quilt shops of Arizona are the genesis of our quilting community. Through shops, people learn how to quilt, form friendships, and watch their fabric collections grow, sometimes to epic proportions. To recognize the contribution of the quilt shop to the fabric of the quilting community, Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame announces the inaugural Quilt Shop of the Year competition.

<u>Criteria for the recognition include</u>: 1) The nominated shop must be an independently-owned quilt shop, currently operating in the State of Arizona - no retail chains will be considered. 2) The nominated shop must have a location that is open to the public, virtual or on-line shops do not qualify for the recognition. 3) The nomination must indicate support of the general public as evidenced by at least 10 signatures on the petition portion of the nomination forms, and 4) The nomination must include a written statement (500 to 750 words) about why the shop deserves the recognition.

The winning shop will be recognized at the Annual Hall of Fame Induction Luncheon, Sunday, September 25, 2011 being held at the Wyndham Gardens, Prescott. While shops may self-nominate for the award, the general public is encouraged to submit nominations of their favorite shop. Complete nomination information is available on Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame web site, www.arizonaquiltershalloffame.org. Nominations must be received no later than May 16, 2011 to qualify for consideration.

It is intended that the Quilt Shop of the Year recognition be part of the organization's annual activities. Friends of Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame will have the opportunity to vote for the shop they feel is most deserving of the recognition. The winning shop will be announced on August 1, in preparation for the Induction Event in September.

Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to celebrate and honor the contribution of Arizonans to quiltmaking and educate the public about quiltmaking, its history, and artisans. The Hall of Fame is a virtual museum, housed at www.arizonaquiltershalloffame.org, and the sponsor of the Arizona Centennial Quilt Project.

Hope you had fun holidays (with some time to quilt?) and that you found time to make a couple of "Best Friends Stars" blocks for the drawings at our January meetings (the pattern was in last month's newsletter). This block features black-and-white prints along with a bright color (your favorite color, or your best friend's favorite?). The pattern is designed to make 2 blocks --one for you and one for your best friend, or maybe 2 to enter in the January drawings! Remember, it's not too late, and each block entered is a chance to win!

And in this newsletter is the pattern for the "Sweetheart Star" block for our February drawings--it has hearts, cupid's arrows, and a star, all in one! A bit fancy, but it's not hard to make. Use pretty Valentine colors --pink and red and white. This is the 12th and final block in our starry sampler for 2010, so don't miss a chance to enter-- and maybe you'll win some beautiful star blocks in February!

Next month, Kay and Evelyn will announce a special new Block of the Month series for 2011--especially for you! Meanwhile, we'll continue to offer our 9 annual pattern sets for sale--only \$5 each, with a whole year's worth of blocks in each set, with color covers. 




PRESIDENT THANK YOU BLOCK

It's time to begin working on our 'Thank You' blocks for our Guild President, Kathy Harris. Here's the pattern. The block should measure 6½" when you finish it. Kathy loves orange so we will use orange fabric for the 6½" block and white for the corner triangles. The blocks can be turned in at the January and February meetings.

- 1) Cut an orange 6½" square block.
- 2) Cut 2 white 3½" square blocks. Mark the diagonal of these blocks.
- Right sides together, layer the white blocks on opposite corners of the orange block and stitch on the diagonal.Figure A
- 4) Press the triangle up. Figure B





Block of the Month - February 2011 "Sweetheart Star" (unfinished size 121/2")


The final block in our starry set has red Valentine hearts and pink Cupid's arrows coming together to form a star! You'll just cut squares and rectangles -- then, use our easy quick-piecing methods to transform them into this pretty block. The center square may be either red or pink—or perhaps a romantic floral or Valentine print—you choose.

Cutting:

Red – four 21/2" x 41/2" rectangles and eight 21/2" squares Pink – four 3" squares and four 21/2" squares White – four 3" squares, twelve 2½" squares, sixteen 1½" squares

Center square – one 4½" square (Valentine colors)

First, use the 8 red 2½" squares and the 16 white 1½" squares, to make the upper halves of the hearts. Line up a white square on top of one corner of a red square, right sides together. Stitch diagonally across the white square, from corner to corner at the angle shown. Trim off the corner, leaving about 1/2" seam allowance; open up and press, with seam allowance going toward the corner. Place another white square on the corner to the right of the first triangle and repeat the diagonal stitching, trimming and pressing.



Do this with all 8 red squares. Stitch together in pairs as shown to make the upper halves ↑ of the 4 hearts.

(You may want to press this seam open.)

Next, use the 4 red rectangles and 8 of the white 21/2" squares to make the lower halves of the hearts (you may recognize them as "flying geese"). Stitch two white squares

diagonally onto each red rectangle, one square at a time, trimming and pressing after each, using the same method you did for the upper halves.

Arrange the upper and lower halves as shown and sew together to make 4 Hearts → (Again, press the seam open, to reduce bulk.)

Arrows:

First make half-square triangles using the 3" squares (4 pink and 4 white): Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on **wrong side** of a white square; place on top of a pink square, right sides together. Stitch 1/4" away from the line, on both sides of the line. Cut apart on drawn line; open up and press seams


toward the pink; makes 2. Repeat to make a total of 8 half-square triangles. Note: These are slightly oversized: Use a square-up ruler with a diagonal line on it to trim them to 21/2"

square, aligning the diagonal seams so they come exactly to the corners of the square.

Arrange the triangles with the remaining white and pink 2½" squares as shown, and stitch together into 4-patch units to make 4 Arrows →

Block Construction:

Arrange the 4 **Hearts** around the 4 sides of the 4½" center square, rotating them so the bottom points of the hearts touch the center square, and the tops of the hearts are nearest the outer edge of the block. Position the Arrows at the 4 outside corners of the block so they point inward to the center square. When all parts are correctly positioned to match the illustration at the top of the page, stitch them together into 3 rows. Press row seams in opposite directions, then stitch rows together to make the Sweetheart Star block.
















