Suzanne Marshall is an international-award winning quilter. As a self-taught quilter who has never taken a lesson, Suzanne has evolved several novel techniques, such as Take-Away Appliqué. Her quilts have won numerous prizes, including multiple awards for Best Hand Workmanship at the American Quilter's Society shows in Paducah and Lancaster. Her most famous quilt is probably "The Mastectomy Quilt". Her quilt "Toujour Nouveau" was named as one of the Twentieth Century's 100 Best American Quilts. This quilt is in the permanent collection of the Museum of the American Quilter's Society in Paducah, Kentucky, as is her "Mother's Day" quilt.

A significant honor was being selected as one of the "World's Distinguished Quilt Artists" to exhibit three selected quilts, "Dragonflowers", "Leafhoppers" and "Konnichiwa" in Tokyo, Japan in January, 2003. In 2010, one of her latest creations, "Vases", received the Best Hand Workmanship Award at the AQS Show in Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

A number of quilts are layered on a bed, often in the order of the date made. The quilts are "turned" and held up one at a time for the viewers to see while a lecturer talks about each one."

# **Block of the Month**

Spring was definitely in the air at our April meetings, with all those wonderful "Spring Chickens" on display! A flock of 14 hens went home with Vickie Oberg, who was the lucky winner on Tuesday, and another 18 went home with Liz Nedrow, our Wednesday winner. Congratulations, ladies, and hope you have fun making them into a quilt! (The paper foundation patterns for the 3" egg and 3" chick are available on the TQG website, if you'd like to add them to your pattern collection.)

At our May meetings, we'll have the drawings for your "May Spring Basket" blocks. You'll find Kay's pattern in last month's newsletter (2 pages--templates and directions; they are also on our website-- in the special Block of the Month supplement section which is located inside the password protected area, between the Newsletters and the Minutes). Use the applique method you choose, and get creative by filling the baskets with flowers or anything you like, for Spring. Bring your basket blocks in May to enter the drawings--this time, you could be a lucky winner!

And in this newsletter is the block pattern for our June drawings. Try the fun "Denim Picnic Block", using recycled jeans or new denim fabric along with colorful sashing strips. Many thanks to Marana cowgirl and long time TQG member, Pat Honea, for sharing this idea with us. Pat has made many denim quilts from her ranch family's jeans! Also, look for our "Denim Picnic Quilt" project sheet, on the website and at the meetings.

We again have all our Block of the Month pattern sets in stock, from 2002 through 2010. They'll be available for \$5 per set at the May and June meetings, while supplies last, so if you're interested in catching up on any of these, see us at the Block of the Month table. Browse our catalog to see what's in each set. We've had some really fun blocks over the years, and you could own them all, in collected sets with color covers!

Block of the Month - June 2011 © 2011 Evelyn George "Denim Picnic Block" (unfinished block size 13½")

Recycle that stash of old jeans, or use new denim fabric, and add lots of bright cotton scraps to make this sturdy and colorful quilt, perfect for a picnic. It makes a great dorm quilt, too! Each block is sashed on only two sides; when blocks are joined to make a top, just add more sashing and cornerstones to complete the two unfinished sides. Check out our special Block of the Month Project Sheet, on the website and at guild meetings, for more tips on working with denim, as well as how to make a Denim Picnic Quilt.



#### Fabric Preparation:

Serge or zigzag raw edges of new denim yardage, and prewash.

Recycled jeans should also be clean. Use sharp shears to cut jeans apart along the inseam and cut out the zipper, avoiding metal parts. If you rip out stitching, use a piece of tape to pick up the resulting lint and grit so it won't get into your sewing machine.

Press if wrinkled, lay out flat, and rotary cut one layer at a time (6" square acrylic ruler is very helpful). Avoid putting very worn or stained portions in your quilt.

### Cutting (for 1 block):

Denim – Cut four 6" squares from the good parts of jeans, and/or from denim fabric of similar weight.

(Use assorted blues or all the same, depending on what you have available.)

Sashing – Cut 8 strips 1½" x 6" from assorted bright prints (regular weight cottons)

Cornerposts – cut four 1½" squares from red

## Adding Fringed Appliques:

Cut freehand shapes such as hearts, flowers, etc. from leftover pieces of denim, making them smaller than the 6" squares. Pin shape onto a square of contrasting denim and stitch about ¼" to ½" inside the shape to applique it down, then snip raw edges about every ¼" to make fringe. Rub snipped edges briskly with a piece of tape to fluff them and pick up the loose threads (but be careful not to fray the raw edges of your square). Fringed edges will fluff even more after the quilt is washed.

Pockets: Pieces with small pockets, embroidery, etc. can be used if you leave about an inch of free space all around them (room for presser foot to sew the seams, and later for walking foot when quilting in the ditch). A jeans seam can be included as long as it's not too thick to sew over.

#### Tips For Sewing With Denim:

- -Use a full 1/4" seam allowance: don't skimp.
- -Don't be tempted to pull off loose denim threads, just trim them if they are in your way, to avoid raveling away your seam allowance. (Once the quilting has been done, they will be secured.)
  -Whenever possible, keep the denimpiece on the bottom while sewing, to help avoid stretching it.

#### **Block Construction:**

Position squares so any appliques, pockets, etc. are oriented upright. Then pin a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" sashing strip to the <u>right hand edge</u> of each denim square, with right sides together, pinning at both ends of the seam so they stay even, and the denim doesn't stretch while you are stitching. Stitch; press the seam allowance toward the sashing (so the denim remains flat).



Stitch one red square to each of the 4 remaining sashing strips. Press seam toward sashing. Place a strip with red square on the <u>upper edge</u> of each denim square, with right sides together and the red square in the corner, as shown in the illustration. Pin at the seam allowance, peeking to be sure you get a good match. Pin at lower end of seam also. Stitch; press toward sashing.

In this manner, sash each square on 2 sides, then arrange the 4 sashed squares to make a large 4-patch, with the sashed edges at the top and right (see block illustration at top of page.) Sew them together, pinning as before. This is your block, with two sides left unsashed.


