History of the Quilt-A-Thon

The first Quilt-a-thon was begun in 1997. It was the idea of President Nancy Landon who passed the work of organizing it to the Program Director, Cathy Dargel. Membership in the Guild was 238 and many members left in the hot summer months and therefore weren't around to sew in August. Yet members who did come (we never take attendance and therefore the number will never be known) were able to sew 20 quilts for an Alzheimer unit (only 15 were promised!).

The following year 26 quilts went to Devon Gables Retirement home with Cathy chairing the event once again. The next year Anne Berry took over from Cathy and with 343 members 33 quilts went to Child Protective services. Anne bested those efforts in 2000 with 49 quilts. The following year, Jo Cady-Bull and Lynn Miller took over as chairs with 375 members and the Drexel Heights Fire Department as the recipient got 60 guilts. (Do you see the "snowball" effect?) By 2002, Evelyn Ewing & Evelyn George took over with New Beginnings for Women & Children as the lucky charity and 33 finished quilts and an additional 31 tops that got sent to local long-armers for finishing!

By 2003, Anne Berry was coaxed out of "retirement" to co-chair the annual Quilt-a-thon with Evelyn George. Nearly 80 quilts were donated to Brazos de Amor orphanage in Agua Prieta that year. In 2004 new chair, Mary Bazzano, took over and a total of 56 quilts were donated to Desert Dialysis of Tucson. By 2005 we had grown to 2 meetings (the institution of the Tuesday Night meeting before the regular Wednesday Day meeting), and Mary Bazzano again organized the Quilt-a-thon, producing 81 quilts for Child Protective Services.

In 2006, Mary Bazzano and the intrepid Guild completed 70 quilts for the Red Cross in Tucson.

Taking a rest from chairing this event, Mary Meserve stepped up in 2007 to chair making 60 quilts for Primavera Foundation and an additional 8 quilts for Project Linus. Flora Alderman and Pam Wright were our chairs in 2008 with 629 total members; 97 members participated in this annual event. A total of 130 quilts were donated to the Rural Metro Fire Department and three Oncology clinics in Tucson. The following year 147 quilts were given to The Daughters of the Nile and AVIVA by chairs Floral Alderman & Pam Wright. And last year 100 quilts and 100 pillowcases made by 100 participating Guild members were given to the Gospel Rescue Mission by chairs Mary Bazzano & Evelyn George.

So in the last 14 years, ten different quild members have chaired this annual event with hundreds of members participating in the sewing. In all seventeen different charities were the lucky recipients of 984 quilts and 100 pillowcases. And we aren't done yet, how many can we do this year?

QUILTERS HALL OF FAME TO INDUCT FOUR

PHOENIX, AZ...Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame announces its 2011 inductees. Those to be inducted include:

- · George D. Butler, Chandler, recognized for his impressive quilt-related charity work,
- Carol Hood, Prescott, for assuming leadership in a variety of quilt groups, lecturing and teaching, publishing, and receiving recognition for her quilts,
- Lynn G. Kough, Chandler, recognized for taking significant leadership in local and national quilt organizations, teaching, and publishing.
- Nancy Landon, Tucson, primarily for her ownership of Cactus Quilt Shop, and using that shop to educate, enlighten, and engage the quilting community.

The inductees were nominated by the general public, voted upon by Friends of Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame, and, finally, selected by Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame Board of Directors. The Class of 2011 is the fourth class of inductees to be honored.

Also announced is the 2011 Arizona Quilt Shop of the Year, Quilters Market, Tucson. Owned by Lynda Luiten, the shop creates a colorful, welcoming shopping treat with classes aplenty for children, beginners, and the experienced quilter. Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame will also recognize Individual Friends of the Year, Carole A. Cohen and Wanda Seale, both of Phoenix, for their efforts as Co-Chairs of the Arizona Centennial Quilt Project. Rim Country Quilt Roundup, Payson, will be honored as the Organizational Friend of the Year.

The formal recognition of inductees and other honorees will take place at a luncheon event on Sunday, September 25, being held at the Wyndham Gardens, Prescott. Also, on Saturday, September 24, the Hall of Fame will sponsor a Shop Hop around the Prescott and Prescott Valley communities. As part of these activities, the first public showing of the Arizona Centennial Commemorative Quilt will take place at Sharlot Hall Museum. The public is invited to participate in the Shop Hop and/or attend the luncheon event. Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame, a non-profit organization, was founded in 2007 to celebrate and honor the contribution of Arizonans to guiltmaking and to educate the public about quiltmaking, its history, and artisans.

These little gems should not take too long to create and complete. What better time to begin work on one than August when the weather is too hot to work on a full size quilt? If you have a completed small quilt please wait until the September meetings to turn these in. The Quilt-a-thon in August won't have a place to turn these in, or a person waiting to accept them. Quilt Show Packets: The quilt show packet, which includes the quilt show entry forms, is available to download and print from our website on the password protected page. If you plan to enter more than one quilt, you can make copies of just the entry form pages. IMPORTANT: the new deadline to turn in entries is Sept. 14th!!! If you are unable to print it this way, send Joey an email at JoeyKiomi@hotmail.com or call her at 502-297-0448 or pick up a printed copy from Joey at the Quilt-a-thon. If you want it mailed to you, send Joey a 4" by 9.5" envelope with your address and at least 61 cents in stamps. Two entries have already been turned in!

It's almost time to submit your entries for our show in January. Entries are due at the September meetings, or can be mailed to our entry chair, Joey Nakagawa, at any time before then. We will take any entry with a reasonable picture depicting what your quilt will look like. Please try and be fairly accurate on the size of your quilt. If you are entering a quilt in the Centennial contest, make sure that you state that on your entry form.

We are still taking names for quilters in our guild that you would like to see featured at our show.


Next, in August we'll have the drawings for your "3-D Pinwheel" blocks, at our Quilt-a-thon meetings (which replace the regular meetings this month). The pattern was in last month's newsletter, so check it out, make a block (or several--they're fun!) and bring them to the Quilt-a-thon--you'll not only have a great time making charity quilts from the pre-cut kits, but you might also be a lucky winner of some 3-D Pinwheels to take home!

And in this newsletter, look for the "Jack in the Beanstalk" block pattern, for our drawings in September. It's mostly made from squares, and very easy to construct--the use of small green squares and an inset "vine" strip, against rich dark colors, creates a climbing vine pattern. (The blocks can be sewn together into vertical rows, as tall as you want your vines to climb!)

We'll have free copies of our current and recent Block of the Month patterns available at the August Quilt-a-thon meetings--look for us up on the stage. And beginning again in September, we'll have the yearly sets available again, at \$5 for each year, so be sure to catch up on anything you might have missed. We hope you're happily quilting your way through summer and staying cool! --- Kay and Evelyn

"Jack & the Beanstalk"



Cutting Instructions: Choose a leaf green for Fabric color (1). Choose 3 other different colors for Fabric (2), Fabric (3), and Fabric (5). Fabric (4) is a green stem color. You can choose brown, reds, oranges, beige, blue, gray, or any darker colored remnants.

Fabric (1) Green: cut eight 2" squares, for leaf effect.

Fabric (2) Brown or beige: cut one 6 ½" square. Cut one 3½" square, and cut two 2" squares.

Fabric (3) Red or orang : cut two 3 1/2" squares. And Cut four 2" squares.

Fabric (5) Blue or gray: Cut one 6 1/2" square. Cut one 3 ½" square and cut two 2" squares.

Fabric (4) Green stem, cut a trip 12 ½" by 1½". This is folded in half lengthwise and sewn on a completed side or column of the block.





- 1. Make two small four patch blocks, using two of the (1) leaf green, one of the fabric (3), and one of Fabric (5) for each four patch. Use the small 2" squares, Green pieces are on diagonally opposite corners.
- 2. Sew one 3 ½" square of fabric (3) and one 3 ½" square of fabric (5) to the two units you just finished, as shown above. Check, see if the colors are touching and if they are next to each other. Sew these units side by side to make a double 4 patch unit. The green pieces should make a diagonal line, like stair steps down.
- 3. Sew the 6 ½" color (5) to the top of the double 4 patch.

This makes one column, ½ of the Block. See below

- 4. Repeat this construction, using different colors in your arrangement of small squares. Use 4 small green squares, two 2" red (or orange) squares, and two 2" brown (or beige) squares to make the second pair of 4 patches. Add a red 3 1/2" square and a beige 3 1/2" square to the 4 patches to make a double 4 patch unit. The green squares should go diagonally up to the right hand side.
- 5. Then sew a 6 ½" beige (color 2) square to the bottom of this double 4 patch unit. This makes the other column (side) of your block.

Finally sew the two long, (columns) together side by side. Your block is finished except for the green stem of the Beanstalk. See the colored illustration.


6. To put in the green strip for the Beanstalk, fold the 12 ½" by 1½" strip in half lengthwise wrong sides together. Sew it to one side of the block or down the middle of your block.

Use a 1/4" seam allowance. The folded green stem will stick out from the quilt surface. | See examples below.








Examples of three blocks in different colors (shades of gray scale).
