I am influenced especially by the energy and color of traditional African designs. All these early experiences combined to stir my love of "primitive" arts and crafts and grew into my focus on folk-art.



I now focus on three related areas:

- design of quilted items using textural fabrics and embellishments
- workshops and retreats

Small Quilt Auction FAQ's

Do I need to complete and turn in an entry form for my quilt donation first? No, the entry form should accompany the quilt when it is turned in. The entry form is available on the main page of our website under the topic Small Quilt Auction, found in the column on the left. We ask that you download, print and complete a form for each quilt submission.

Where do I turn in my quilt? Quilts may be turned in at the Quilting for Others' table at the back of the hall at either the evening meeting or the morning meeting. Quilts will be accepted in September, October, and November.

How do I know if my quilt will be accepted? All quilt donations will be accepted. We need quilts for both the Silent Auction (taking place on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday morning of the Quilt Fiesta!) and for the live auction on Sunday afternoon.

What do I need to do to prepare my quilt for the auction? Every quilt should have a 2" sleeve stitched across the top of the quilt for hanging, and a label on the back. The information on the label should include the name of the quilt, the name of the quilt maker, and the year it was completed.

I cannot complete a small quilt by the November 9 deadline. Can I turn in a quilt at the January meeting? Sorry, but no. The deadline has been set after much consideration by the auction committee. The committee needs to work to get the quilts ready for the auction after they have all been turned in.

We look forward to seeing all the wonderful quilts you are working on for our first venture into a charity auction. Remember, the quilts are supposed to be small – no more than 80" around the perimeter. Thanks for your interest.



Quilt show entries are due this month. So print out the form, fill it out, include a picture (even if your quilt is not put together take a picture) and bring it to one of our September meetings. You may also send your entry to Joey Nakagawa any time before then. We would love to see new members and old members enter quilts for a spectacular Quilt Fiesta. If you have a quilt for the small quilt auction, the entry date is November. They may also be turned in earlier if you would like.

Just reminder: Signups to help hang the show and hostess during the show will begin at the October meetings. Please think about how you would like to help setting up the show and working during the show.

This is our last year as quilt show chairs. If anyone is interested in taking on the job for next year, this is a good time to shadow us to see what we do. A good place to start is to attend a quilt show meeting. The next show meeting is September 16, at the Police Station on the corner of 22nd and Alvernon at 10am. This is the time of year that the quilt show committees go into high gear working to make a wonderful show. Please feel free to come and see how the committees work. 

Answers for the Quilted Word Twist: Mary Meserve, Sue Spargo, Quilt top, Saint Francis, Quilt Fiesta, Block of the Month, Centennial Fabric, Barbara Bozdog

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TUCSON (aka the Martha Cooper Library quilt) Yes, it is heroic!! The quilt is about 123 inches long and 56 inches wide. It will be displayed behind the computer stations in the library.

Last March I accepted the challenge of making a quilt from the 36 blocks created by members of the Martha Cooper Library community to celebrate Tucson's 235th birthday. Some of these creatively made blocks featured embellishments of pipe cleaners, sequins, Mylar confetti, foam pieces, leather, and other unknowns; these were glued on! After receiving permission from Margaret Guerrero, Managing Librarian, we separated the quilt blocks from the spacer blocks in a partially pieced quilt top. Richard suggested appliquéing the resized quilt blocks onto a neutral background with the 1.5 inch red sashing to separate the individual blocks. He selected the fabrics we have donated to this project. Most of the pipe cleaners were replaced with color matched cording. The machine quilting was done such that it kept the spirit of the individual designs. Shari Thompson

Ed was one of those workers, but he designed & made our hanging system which hasn't changed since he invented it over 30 years ago! How many things that you know of are still the same after that many years? Now that's workmanship!



Block of the Month

What fun to see all the colorful 3-D Pinwheel blocks displayed on the stage, at our Quilt-a-thon meetings in August! Congratulations to our winners, Mary Bazzano, who won 8 on Tuesday and Connie Weigel, who won 18 on Wednesday.

At our September meetings, we'll have the drawings for your Jack and the Beanstalk blocks, so be sure to make one (or several)--see Kay's pattern in last month's newsletter. Bring them to the September meetings to enter. Maybe you'll be the winner--wouldn't these make a fun quilt for someone young at heart?

And in this newsletter, you'll find the pattern for the "Midnight Pumpkin" block. You can enter it in the October drawings with or without a face. Only 9 pieces for the basic block, and if you can't resist, add a jack-o-lantern face, with the applique method of your choice. These would be a perfect addition to any Halloween or Fall quilt!

Hope you'll have fun entering your blocks each month, and who knows? You could be the next lucky winner of a bunch!

In September, we'll resume sales of our Block of the Month pattern sets. They're only \$5 each for a whole year's worth of blocks, and they have colored covers, too. Block of the Month - October 2011 © 2011 Evelyn George
 "Midnight Pumpkin" (unfinished block size 12½")


This big pumpkin's just waiting out in the garden, ready to be picked tonight! Choose a deep orange print, add a medium green stem, set them against a midnight sky of dark blue, purple or black, and you'll set the mood for some Halloween fun!

Cutting:


Orange – 9 ½" x 12 ½"

Green – 2" x 2 ½"

Purple – one 2" x 2 ½", two 3 ½" x 5 ½", and four 2 ½" squares




Diagonal corner piecing is used to stitch the four purple squares to the corners of the orange rectangle:



Line up a purple square at each corner of the orange rectangle, right sides together. Stitch diagonally across each square, from corner to corner, as shown. Trim off the corners, leaving ¼" seam allowance. Unfold the purple triangles and press them toward the corners.

To make the stem, stitch the 2" x 2 ½" green and purple pieces together, along the 2 ½" edge. Stitch a 3 ½" x 5 ½" purple rectangle to either side of the stem section, and stitch the upper and lower sections of the block together.



--Do you want to make a jack-o-lantern out of your pumpkin?
 (This is *optional* for the Block of the Month drawings.)

Iron some paper-backed fusible web to the wrong side of a piece of yellow or black fabric, following the manufacturer's directions, and cut out desired shapes for eyes, nose and mouth. Remove the paper backing, position them on the pumpkin and fuse them in place. Zigzag stitch around the shapes to hold them securely.
