



As I mentioned at the meetings, this is a new procedure and as such has had some little bumps. Overall it is working very well. For those of you who would like to sign up at home with a calendar and cup of coffee nearby, please go on-line and do so. Google VolunteerSpot. When their site comes in view you will have to sign in with your name and email address. The organization is the Tucson Quilt Fiesta. When you click on that it will show you the calendar of January and our dates, Jan. 20, 21,22 will be marked. Click on the date you are interested in working, choose your time and either sitting or standing. Click on sign up here. Sign up by clicking on the + sign. Click on save &close. At this point you can sign up for more than one time slot! When done click on Confirm. Next click on Continue and you will receive a confirmation email. The site really will walk you through the process so please try it. If this doesn't work for you, contact me and I can enter your information. At Guild General meetings, you often hear us refer to the 'Candlelighters group' when it comes to the Christmas stockings and pillowcases. This article will explain to our seasoned members and those of you who have recently joined the mission of the Candlelighters group.

Candlelighters, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, is a parent-run support network organization. They educate, support, serve and advocate for families of children with cancer, bereaved families, survivors of childhood cancer, and the professionals that care for them.



A few years ago, a friend whose daughter was battling cancer approached me regarding donations of pillowcases. Did I happen to know of anyone who could help make bright pillowcases for the children undergoing treatments? Of course I knew...our many FANTASTIC members!! My original request was for 300, hoping to receive 150. The first collection yielded over 600!!! The donations have not stopped! We have been logging the donations onto the Million Pillowcase Challenge, and our current count is over 3,000. Then, a couple of years ago, the woman who was coordinating the Candlelighter's Holiday party mentioned to me that she herself made all the stockings, and what a time consuming project it was for her. I told her that our members would be happy to take over the making of said stockings, and to this date you've made somewhere around 400. Candlelighters uses the stockings and pillowcases to help brighten the lives of these children and their siblings. Our members have a great time making these small, instant gratification projects. What could be a better match?

The overflow of pillowcases and stockings continue to be donated to various organizations: Veterans, Hospice, Diamond Children's Center, Desert Dialysis, and many other groups. Please continue this ongoing effort to brighten up the lives of those whose lives need sunshine. —Kathy Harris, Vice President

Block of the Month

We had some really cute "Midnight Pumpkins" for our October Block of the Month drawings--and our lucky winners were Sara Rumbaugh, who won 5 on Tuesday, Margot Garcia,11, and Mary Bazzano,10, on Wednesday. Congratulations, ladies, and thanks to all who entered your blocks.

At the November meetings, we'll have drawings for your "Mama's Pie" blocks, so gather your ingredients and start sewing, not baking! The pattern was in last month's newsletter. Directions are given for freehand cutting your very own pie crust and plate for this easy fusible block, or you can go to the Block of the Month section of this website and print out a template sheet for them. These pie blocks would make such a fun wall hanging or table runner, so don't miss the chance to enter one (or more!) You might win a pantry full!

And in this newsletter, you'll find the pattern for "Starry Night," an elegant, bordered fourpointed star for December. We'll have the drawings for these blocks at our December Holiday Potluck meetings.

Hope you'll find time to make each month's block, and bring it to the meetings to enter in the drawings--YOU might be the winner of a windfall of blocks, just in time to make a special quilt or other gift for someone on your list!

"Starry Night Block" (unfinished block size 121/2")

Block of the Month - December 2011 by Kay Hendricks

We start with a 4-pointed star, add a frame and Decorate it with embroidery stitches. This block is made from only 2 templates: 12 pieces and 4 framing strips.

. Use any color, be sure there is plenty of contrast between the dark, medium and light shades. Color – for example, dark blue, bright red, and bright yellow, or green or orange. What's your favorite color?



- 1. Background: deep blue, blue ombre, or changing hue.
- 2. Stars: bright colors(red), plain or small prints that appear solid.
- 3. Frame: contrasting color, different color from its background, Use a solid color or linear designs.

Cutting Directions:


- 1. Cut 8 pieces B for Star's background. [4 of B and 4 of B reversed.]
- 2. Cut 4 pieces A for each star A. [points]
- 3. Cut 4 strips at least 2 ½ inches wide by amount needed for frame. 4 x (2.5" x 11") Or 2 x (2.5" x 8.5") and 2 x (2.5" x 12.5")


Sewing Instructions:

- 1. Sew a pair of background pieces [B and Br] to the sides of an A piece. this makes one of the 4 Units that makes up a star. The seam allowance is trimmed so that it aligns at the corners with a dot. Sew down to the points.
- 2. Make 4 of these Units.


Press seam allowances to the background (blue).

- 3. Set the 4 Units together like a four patch, placing the wide ends of the star points at the center. Sew two units together, side by side, and then sew the other two together.
- 4. This makes double Units, or half a star. See picture. Press seams in opposite directions. →
- Now sew the double units, one above the other, Together, like a four patch. Press seams toward outer edge.












- 6. Use the 4 strips to make a frame around your star.
- 7. Sew short strips 8.5" to sides, then sew long strips 12.5" to the ends, top & bottom. There are alternate ways to sew on a frame.






- 8. Press seams; square up to 12.5'. Trim off any extra.
- 9. Decorate with decorative stitches along the seam lines or down the centers or the star points. Add beads or sequins if desired. Use hand or machine embroidery stitches to Decorate similar to "crazy quilt."

If you have Marti Michell [™] Templates, you can Use pieces D 23 and D 24 for your pattern.









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LET'S GET READY FOR AN AUCTION!!!

Quilt for a Cause will be announcing the details of their Silent and Live auction at the November Guild meetings. This auction of donated quilts will be held at TMC on March 2, 2013. To all of the members of this wonderful Guild, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your donation of quilts and your support of time and energy in helping us prepare for our auctions since 2003. For those of you who are new to our Guild, we have raised \$495,000 in our fight against women's cancers over the past 7 years. TMC, the U of A Foundation, American Cancer Society and St. Elizabeth's of Hungary have been our local recipients.

This is our <u>Mission Statement</u>: To use the art and business of quilt-making to pursue medical advances against breast and gynecological cancers. Funds will be raised for research, to continue the education of medical professionals and to support clinical organizations that raise awareness, offer detection, and provide treatment to all women.

Many of us have been touched by breast or gynecological cancers and quilters have told us that it gives them great pleasure to donate a quilt to us in honor or in memory of a friend or loved one. We have made it possible for 4 women to receive surgery and treatment for breast cancer at St. Elizabeth's of Hungary. These were young working women who could not afford health insurance. TMC has used their funds to teach doctors and nurses the latest techniques used to fight gynecological cancers, allowed women without insurance to receive their mammograms, bought surgical equipment and helped to purchase a DaVinci Robot to make gynecological surgeries less invasive. Over the past years Quilt for a Cause has managed to keep their expenses to less than 1 percent...a fact that we are very proud to share with you.

Ninety five percent of our quilts are donated by members of the Tucson Quilters Guild. That's why we love you so much! Over the years people have come to know who we are and what we do. We have received \$30,000 from a local foundation who truly believe in our work and they are aware of the time and effort that YOU THE QUILTERS have put into the design and creation of your lovely quilts to benefit the "Cause".

We sincerely hope that you and/or your Bee group will donate another beautiful quilt to our "Cause". In March 2012 we will begin to receive the quilts. We've had great success in displaying and selling them within our community before the auction. The preferred quilt sizes would be nothing smaller than 18" on any side; or larger than 90" in any direction. Popular themes that have sold well in the past are Floral, Garden, Southwest, Asian, Stars, Holidays, Animals and Baby and Juvenile. Traditional quilts and quilts with visual impact are also top sellers.
