











Block of the Month

Mama would be proud of the delicious looking pie blocks you entered at the November meetings! Yum! (The pattern was in the October newsletter, and the pie crust template is printable from our website's Block of the Month supplemental section.) Congratulations to our lucky November winners, Janet Bodell, who won 10 "Mama's Pie" blocks on Tuesday and Kay McDonough, who won 10 on Wednesday!

At our December Holiday Gatherings, we'll have the drawings for your "Starry Night" blocks (the directions for this pattern are in the November newsletter, and hope you were able to pick up an accurate template sheet at the last meeting--or you could use Marti Michell's TM templates D23 and D24 if you have them. Hope you'll make some to enter--you might win, just in time to add them to a special quilt for the holidays!

And in this newsletter is the pattern for "Shadow Box" blocks for our January drawings. These 12 1/2" blocks are so quick to make! We also give the cutting measurements for 6 1/2" blocks--they could easily be combined in a quilt, because four 6 1/2" blocks combine to equal one 12 1/2" block. For the January drawings, enter either size: one large or four small blocks = one entry! This will be a fun scrappy quilt!


Remember to check out the free patterns at the Block of the Month table, also the \$5 pattern sets, each with a whole year's worth of Block of the Month patterns. We'll be selling these at the Tucson Quilt Fiesta, and we usually sell out, so if you want a particular set, be sure to get yours at the January meeting (no pattern sales at the December meetings).

Block of the Month - January 2012 © 2011 Evelyn George "Shadow Box" (unfinished block size 121/2")*

This is a wonderful block for scrap quilts! Make each block from a different pair of fabrics – a light and a dark. (It's OK to include some mediums, too, as long as there is enough contrast between the two fabrics you put together.) Multi-colored dark prints such as Asian, dark florals and batiks work well. Include some dark reds, purples, blacks, blues and greens; and to unify this group of scrappy blocks. make the light half a rich "antique" gold/beige-or just choose compatible lights and darks from your stash. It's a scrap quilt!

These blocks lend themselves to a variety of arrangements -they form patterns like the ones seen in log cabin guilts.



Cutting:

Light - One 41/2" x 121/2" rectangle and three 41/2" squares Dark - One 41/2" x 121/2" rectangle and three 41/2" squares

Top row: Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on wrong side of one dark square.

Place on top of the light rectangle, with right

sides together, and edges aligned at right hand end of rectangle. Stitch diagonally across square at the angle shown, stitching the two layers together. Trim off corner, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Unfold triangle and press seam toward corner (toward dark - see arrow).





Bottom row: Make same way as top row, using a light square and dark rectangle, stitching at same angle as above. Trim; this time, press seam away from corner (toward dark).



Center row: First, make one triangle square: draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on wrong side of one of the remaining light squares. Then place it on top of a dark square, right sides together, and stitch on the line.








Trim off corner triangle ¼" away from stitching, as shown in illustration above. ↑ Open up the resulting triangle square and press seam toward the dark. Center the triangle square between a dark square on its left and a light square on its right, positioning them to form the center row (as shown in block assembly, below) and stitch together. Press seams away from center.

Block assembly: Arrange the three rows, positioning them to make the block design shown. (Note that top row needs to be turned around from the way it was when you made it.) Stitch rows together, pinning where diagonal seams need to line up. Press seams away from center row.

So easy! Make some more! Make them all different if you wish.

* Want a little more challenge? Make these as 6½" blocks – the measurements are 21/2" and 61/2" (instead of 41/2" and 121/2").

Four 6½" blocks stitched together = one 12½" block (unfinished sizes).



Bits 'n Pieces

The Bear Facts: Each year now for a long time Tucson Guild Members dress bears to give away to needy children. Do you ever wonder when/how we started to do this as it really seems far removed from making quilts? Well it started in 1989 at the suggestion of member #9, Marie Child. She asked Guild members to make a doll quilt for the Salvation Army doll give away program for needy children. Marie was known at that time for her miniature quilts (in the 1990 Quilt show she won 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place for 3 different miniatures). By 1991, the Salvation Army gave us dolls & bears to dress to "go along" with the quilts that we were making each Christmas. We dressed 63 that first year! Marie continued to head this unofficial committee until 1995 & Gaye Vaterlaus took over the job but only for one year & then Marie was back to bearsit.




In 1997, the Guild officially recognized this effort and made it a standing committee and the count of "dressings" of dolls & bears was 110. In 1999, Irene Keating took over this committee and by 2000, we dressed 120 of the 385 dolls & bears the Salvation Army gave away that year. By 2002, Charlotte McEldowny & Hope Seely took over the committee and that year we dressed 117 bears & dolls. But in 2003, the Salvation Army discontinued the program due to financial concerns. So the Guild decided to buy 48 bears that year to continue this tradition giving the dressed creations to New Beginnings & the Tucson Center for Women & Children. New chairs Kaye Winalis & Joan

Wendel took over in 2004 & 84 bears were purchased for Casa de los Ninos & the Arizona School for the Deaf & Blind. In 2005, 100 bears were dressed and given to New Beginnings. In 2006, Sally Zavoyna took over the committee and another 100 bears were dressed. 2007 saw Mary Bazzano, Vivian Streeter & Masayo Morgan step up for this job donating them to Tu Nidito, Child Family Services & Christian Family Care Agency. This committee was adopted by Margaret Newman and Mary Meserve in 2009 and they have been working on it since then. In 2009, Aviva was made our charity for the distribution of bears each year throughout the year. Imagine how many children have had their faces brightened over these past 22 years! And this all began with Marie's suggestion; isn't that a great legacy? - -Cathy Dargel, Guild Historian
