QUILT AUCTION NEWS: Many thanks to all who have donated one or more quilts to this year's auction. We have one hundred eleven quilts; donated by seventy quilters. While most of the quilters are Guild members, a few are not. By now, all quilt donors should have received a thank you letter in the mail. Make sure you open your letters; there is a little something extra in each envelope.

The quilts have all been evaluated and divided into two groups – those in the silent auction, and those in the live auction. A minimum price has been determined for every quilt, as well as a buy-it-now price for each quilt in the silent auction. Every quilt has been assigned a number, the quilt labels have been typed and printed and are pinned to each quilt. The quilts have all been arranged in panels for hanging, and are ready to go.

Now I am asking for your help one more time - please encourage your friends to attend the quilt show to view all the wonderful quilts in our Small Quilt Gallery, and to come on Sunday afternoon at 1:00 to participate in the live auction. Don't forget to come yourself as well. The silent auction quilts will be hanging along the outside 'wall' on the north side of the demo area – straight ahead as you enter the show. The live auction quilts will be hung inside the demo area and may be viewed between the live demonstrations. Be sure to check these quilts out and see what wonderful work has been made and donated this year. —Sally Dickinson, Small Quilt Auction Chair

Please come and enjoy the quilt show and vote for the individual quilt that most exemplifies excellence in quilt making workmanship.

The January meetings will be the last opportunity to sign up for takedown. We really, really need your help. We will give you a pass to enter the show any time after 1:00 PM to get a final chance to shop and see who won the ribbons. The takedown crew will assemble at 4:00 PM to get their assignments and will begin disassembling the show soon after. The more people we get to help, the faster it will go. As soon as the room is clear, the quilters who helped out will be able to pick up their quilts right away. So stop at the table in the back of the meeting room to sign up and get your free ticket. MAY DAY! MAY DAY! ALL HANDS ON DECK! If you're reading this newsletter...it's January and the Guild's annual Quilt Fiesta is just around the corner. Members: we need your help and we need it now! Our show is entirely staffed by volunteer Guild members. As of this moment, less than 50% of our members have signed up to complete their annual obligation to the Guild. There is no more time to procrastinate...choose a hostess shift (or two) and SIGN UP NOW! It's your civic duty and, did we mention, we need your help now!

We are alarmed to report that there are sitting and standing positions unfilled at almost every 2 hour shift. On Friday and Saturday, we need volunteers for standing positions from 9-11, from 1-1, from 1-3 and from 3-5. On Sunday, we need volunteers for standing positions from 10-noon, noon-2 and 2-4. If you are uncertain, please read the descriptions of these jobs below.

Volunteers for sitting positions are required for shifts on Friday afternoon, all day Saturday and all day Sunday. Even if you cannot stand for two hours, you can serve the Guild by signing up for a sitting hostess shift. The jobs are not difficult...please read the descriptions below. Your participation is required so that the show can run smoothly for guests and Guild members alike. VOLUNTEER SIGN UP CAN BE FOUND ONLINE OR AT THE JANUARY GENERAL MEETINGS. YOU CAN EMAIL HOSTESS CHAIR (KATHY HUTCHESON) WITH ANY QUESTIONS: kathyronhutcheson@yahoo.com WE NEED YOU! We can't continue to do it without you. Please get on board and sign up!

For those new members who have never been a hostess before, or for members who need a refresher, we will be holding a HOSTESSING ORIENTATION ½ hour before the evening and morning meetings in January. Please try to attend and we'll answer all your questions. Just in case you cannot attend, here is the basic 411 and also some tips for making your mandatory hostess shift more enjoyable:

WHAT: The Tucson Quilt Fiesta is our Guild's largest undertaking each year. It is also the primary fundraiser supporting the activities provided for Guild members throughout the year. Our show, the largest annual quilt show in Arizona, has a great reputation and a strong regional following. It is an event all Guild members can be proud of.

WHERE: The Fiesta is held at the Tucson Convention Center in the south end of the building. Very little free parking is available on the street so, whether visiting or attending as a volunteer, plan to pay for parking in the lots on the east or west of the building. WHEN: The 2012 show will be open on Friday, January 20, from 9AM to 5PM, on Saturday, January 21, from 9AM to 5PM and on Sunday, January 22, from 10AM to 4PM.

WHO: The quilt show is organized and run by Guild members. There is no paid staff. Your annual membership comes with a commitment to the Guild...all members are required to work at least one volunteer shift at the quilt show. Of course, in reality, many members take on much more responsibility...the single volunteer shift is designed as a minimum requirement for each Guild member. Please remember that we need your help to hold a safe and successful show...with almost 700 members, we shouldn't have to beg for your assistance. We need you to step up NOW.

HOW: How can you help? Sign up for your hostess shift. You are the Guild's representative and an ambassador for quilting. Enjoy your chance to interact with the public. We offer several ways for you to help out, stand up jobs and sitting jobs, all organized in two hour shifts. Please read the following and choose something that suits your needs: No matter which job you choose to do, we have some recommendations for you: Wear comfortable shoes and, if possible, quilted or embellished clothing. Store your personal items in a fanny pack or in the trunk of your vehicle. THERE IS NO PLACE AT THE QUILT SHOW TO STORE YOUR PURSE OR PERSONAL ITEMS. The Guild is not responsible for lost or stolen items and we cannot keep them for you while you volunteer.

Be sure to allow ample time to park, visit the restroom and check in with your friends before you enter the show. Plan to sign in for your shift 15 minutes before your scheduled time and turn off all cell phones and pagers during your shift. NEW THIS YEAR: volunteers will enter the show through the exit door opposite the public entrance. You'll check in at the door and proceed to the Hostess Table where you will receive your specific assignment and your hostess ribbon.

Smile and have fun while you volunteer but please keep your personal conversations with friends to a minimum. We don't rope off our displayed quilts as they often do at shows. This means that WE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SAFETY OF THE QUILTS ON DISPLAY. Gently ask visitors to obey the rules...no touching the quilts, no carrying pens or food & drink in the aisles, no rolling carts. If you find someone who will not comply, you don't need to press the point. Inform Kathy at the Hostess Table and we will have security assist with handling the non-cooperative visitor.

Once you have received your assignment from the Hostess Table, please proceed directly to your section to relieve the person who worked the prior shift. Be sure to introduce yourself so that they can share any pertinent information. For example, white glove hostesses should point out to their replacements any interesting attributes of the quilts in their section...which have great stories attached, which have special backs, etc. Being familiar with these can make your own shift much more fun and interesting.

Stay at your post until you are relieved. Concentrate on your assignment and you can feel good about fulfilling your commitment to the Guild with grace. You can visit with friends and shop the vendors afterwards! Please be prepared to remain for 10 minutes awaiting your replacement. Share pertinent information with them and check out at the Hostess Table. There you can return your hostess ribbon and, if applicable, your white gloves.

May Day! May Day! All Hands on Deck! (continued from page 5) Illness and last minute emergencies can happen to any of us. Should you become unable to fulfill your hosting duties, please notify Kathy ASAP (435)640-1963 so that a replacement volunteer can be found. As hard as we try, you may not get the specific job you requested so please be flexible... last minute changes are inevitable. Be assured, however, that if you signed up for a sitting position, we will find you a sitting position.

QUILT ANGELS are those who volunteer for two or more shifts. These can be worked consecutively, on the same day or on different days – however you wish. To reward your angelic contribution, you will receive free admission to the show on another day of your choice. You'll find your name on a list at the exit door (where volunteers check in) and you'll be checked off when you come in to 'collect' your free day. We really appreciate your help and enthusiasm!

Here are some descriptions of specific host duties that you might request:

STANDING: WHITE GLOVE. You'll be assigned to an aisle of the show where your primary responsibilities are to ensure the safety of the quilts on display and to provide information to visitors about these quilts and about quilting in general. It's a great opportunity to share your love of quilting and to engage our guests. You'll wear white gloves & a hostess ribbon...as no one is allowed to touch the quilts, your gloves allow you to show interesting features and quilt backs to the visitors. Be friendly while reminding them not to touch the quilts and to keep pens or pencils away from the quilts. No foods or beverages are allowed on the show floor for obvious reasons. Not even water or children's sippy cups. If asked for information about a specific quilter or about quilts for sale, refer them to the Hostess Table where they can leave messages for quilt-makers. WE DO NOT GIVE OUT PERSONAL INFORMATION ABOUT GUILD MEMBERS. Be sure to share noteworthy details with your replacement when you are relieved.

STANDING: ENTRANCE. Bring your cheeriest smile for this assignment: welcoming our visitors and offering programs and raffle tickets for the door prizes. You should be prepared to answer questions about the location of restrooms, food concessions and exits. You'll also intercept any rolling carts as they present a hazard in the aisles and are not allowed in the show except for medical carts (oxygen, etc.).

SITTING: CONCESSIONS. You must be cordial but firm...no one is allowed to bring food or drinks outside the concession areas.

SITTING: EXIT DOORS. Those assigned to the front exit doors will inquire if departing guests plan to return the same day. If so, attach a paper bracelet required for readmission. You'll also check IN the volunteers arriving for their hosting shifts & direct them to the Hostess Table. In addition, you'll check in our Quilt Angels when they arrive for their free day. Those assigned to the side & rear exit doors will check as people enter to make sure they have paid admission. Vendors will be wearing identifying lanyards. Expect heavy traffic during the lunch hour. Any questions can be directed to LaDonna Black who is in charge of concession areas & back doors.

SITTING: HOSTESS CHECK IN. Requires arrival 20 minutes BEFORE your shift time. You'll send volunteers to their assigned positions, You'll distribute white gloves & hostess ribbons. You may be asked to 'cover' another sitting position after everyone has checked in.

ADDITIONAL SPECIALTY SITTING POSITIONS: AZ CENTENNIAL QUILT. Distribute information about the centennial quilt and ensure its safety while on display at our show. MEMBERSHIP. Display a welcoming & enthusiastic attitude while registering new Guild members...many people join at the quilt show. This job may require handling money. You must be comfortable with that. PIN & DVD SALES. Involves handling money...let us know when assigned if you are not comfortable making change. SMALL QUILT RAFFLE. Give information about the inaugural event and instructions to those who wish to sign up for the silent auction. Specifics will be available at check in. Please direct your questions to Hostess Chair Kathy Hutcheson. Thanks in advance for doing your part to make our annual Quilt Fiesta a great success!

CALLING ALL DESIGNERS! We need to start working on the Raffle Quilt for 2014! Do you have ideas for the next raffle quilt? To start we just need a committee to find several designs for everyone to vote on. Please let me know if you are interested. —Mary Meserve



Block of the Month - February 2012 © 2011 Evelyn George "Sweet Heart Block" (unfinished block size 12½")*

Here's a quick and easy pieced block to make for a special quilt. There are only 3 main pieces in each heart, plus 4 smaller squares that are added to help shape the curves. Use Valentine red or pink for the hearts, and white-on-white, or a print that is mostly white, for the background. Valentine prints would be pretty!

Cut:

Red – two 3" x 4" rectangles, and two 4" x 6½" rectangles White – Two 6½" squares, two 3" squares, and eight 1½" squares




Diagonal corner piecing is used to stitch the 1½" white squares to the red rectangles, rounding off the corners that form the heart shape.

To make one heart: Line up 1½" white squares at two corners each of a small and a large red rectangle, with right sides together, as illustrated below, left.

Note that the red rectangles must be positioned <u>exactly</u> like this, and squares added <u>only</u> to the corners shown, in order to round off only the corners that shape the heart!

Diagonally stitch across the small white squares, stitching the two layers together. Trim off corners, leaving 1/4" seam allowance; press triangles toward corners.







Heart (make 2)

Arrange the two red rectangles with rounded corners and the 3" white square, as shown, above center, and stitch together to make a heart, above right. Make two hearts.

Arrange two hearts and two 6½" white squares as shown in illustration at top of page, and stitch together to make the Sweet Heart Block.

Nine of these blocks would make a crib size quilt (about 41" square, including borders ½" and 2"). With hearts positioned as suggested, it would look something like the one shown at right. →

These versatile hearts could also be arranged a number of other ways, depending on the look you'd like for your quilt.
