Now onto business! Carol Taylor is our featured speaker for April. In her website biography it states that she "approaches her quilt making with intensity and a seemingly boundless energy". President's Message





Small Quilt Auction News

It is time to begin thinking about the Small Quilt Auction for 2013, even as we are wrapping up the Hopi Project from our 2012 auction. In the first auction sponsored by the Guild, we had a total of 110 quilts donated by 70 quilters. These quilters represented just about 10% of the Guild membership. This year let's set a goal to increase the participation in the auction to 20% of our membership. Of course we'd like every member to participate!

At the Quilt Fiesta! meeting held last Friday, Quilt for a Cause was chosen to be the recipient of the proceeds from our 2013 auction. Since the Quilt for a Cause auction will be held in March 2013, we will be working in tandem with that organization.

Again this year we are asking members to make and donate a small quilt for the auction to be held as part of the Quilt Fiesta! in January 2013. Quilts that sold really well in our auction included those with a Southwestern theme, and landscape quilts, especially southwest landscapes. Some holiday quilts sold well, though Christmas themes did not do as well. It may be that by the middle of January people are tired of that holiday. These are just suggestions - you are welcome to donate any type of quilt and all will be gratefully accepted. Quilts may be turned in at the meetings in September, October and November, with the deadline being the November 14, 2012 general meeting, or postmarked by November 14 if you are out of town.

Quilt size again should be no bigger than 80" around the perimeter, and each quilt needs to have a 2" hanging sleeve across the top of the quilt. Entry forms with the guidelines are available on the website as well as at the meetings at the Quilting for Others table. All quilts need to have the entry form completed and attached with a straight pin when turned in. — Sally Dickinson, Small Quilt Auction Chairperson

100 Years, 100 Quilts Guild Programs

The Tucson Quilters Guild is presenting programs at the Arizona Historical Society Museum in coordination with the *100 Years*, *100 Quilts Exhibition* which opened in February and runs through December 31, 2012.

On March 3rd, seven youngsters enjoyed making a "Little Quilt" at the First Saturday Family Activity. Six teens and one five-year old girl participated as Shari Thompson presented the project.

Cathy Dargel led the Second Saturday "Meet the Quilter" program. Cathy showed photos and described her inspiration and creation of her quilt, "100 Years of Tucson Landmarks" displayed in the Exhibition. Guests learned about sketching, fabric selection and quilting tips as well as some Tucson history and stories.

The Guild's next programs at the Museum are May 5th First Saturday when the children will make a small Southwestern Wall Hanging and May 12th when guests will have the opportunity to "Meet the Quilter", Ann Adams. All programs start at 11:00 a.m. and are free with admission to the Museum. We encourage you to bring your children or grandchildren to enjoy a bit of quilting craft and to come hear about some of the lovely quilts in the Exhibit.

HOW: Help Our Warriors: Our next meeting is on April 16, 2012, from 1:00 to 4:00pm at Bella Quiltworks. We will meet there the third Monday of each month. If you have any questions, please call Laurie Mullins at home: 520-883-3568 or cellphone: 520-252-5216. Look for us on Facebook!

Come help our warriors! We need people to make twin size guilts, lap guilts (3x5), baby blankets (3x3), heart pillows, shawls, and tote bags. Many people in the guild also knit or crochet. We could use socks (white), baby blankets (3x3), knitted or crocheted caps, and shawls. Remember, these days not all soldiers are men.

Collection of Supplies for Hopi Quilters

We have begun collecting quilting supplies to send to the Hopi Reservation for the quilters there. On the reservation there are six community centers supporting the residents who live in the nearby villages and in the outlying lands. We are making a total of 42 'kits', each bagged separately, to be given to individual quilters. In addition to the 'kits' we will provide supplies to the community centers to be used by all the quilters.

To help supplement the budgeted \$4,000 that we raised with the Small Quilt Auction, I am asking each of you, as a Guild member to donate extra supplies that you may have, but do not plan to use. Here is a chance to clean out your stash. We are purchasing 42 cutting mats, rotary cutters, 3"x18" rulers, scissors, needles, pins, batting, and thread. Money left after this purchase will be used to fill in with other supplies as needed after the April Guild meetings.

Items needed include: fabric (not scraps) – cotton solids were most requested, fabric with Native American themed prints, other prints, cotton flannel, fleece, packs of bias tape, embroidery thread, crochet thread, yarn (all used for tying quilts), lace, straight pins and T-pins, needles for piecing and quilting, needles with a large eye for tying the quilts, quilt books and magazines, and sewing machines in working order. If you have extra rulers or other cutting supplies you want to donate we would certainly take those as well.

Check out the Pattern of the Month page on our website. There you will find patterns to make little pincushions. We are hoping that while you make one for yourself, you will also make one for the Hopi – we will begin accepting these at the April meetings if you have them made so we can send them in the 'kits'. Why not sign your name on the bottom to personalize the pincushion as well?

I will post a link to this list on our website so that you can refer to it, or have your friends refer to it without opening the protected area for the newsletter. I thank you all in advance for all your help with this project.

Why:	Come to get involved with all aspects of the Guild, to make new friends, learn new quilting skills, share, but most of all, to have <i>FUN</i> .




Pattern of the Month April 2012

"Basket Pincushion" (4 5/8" finished)

Sally Dickinson, who was in charge of the small quilt auction at the last show, had a wonderful idea for supplementing the funds raised by the auction. She suggested that for Pattern of the Month, we have a pincushion, and ask that interested members make an extra one for a Hopi quilter. We would like to have at least 40 pincushions to include with the supplies we will be



sending them. So, Sally designed a Basket Pincushion (traditional piecing with an appliqued handle) and Evelyn designed a stylized Butterfly Pincushion (pieced) and a Flying Geese Pincushion (paper-pieced). Here's the Basket Pincushion, and please look for the other two in the Pattern of the Month section of the TQG website). These patterns will also be available at the Pattern of the Month table at the April meetings. Why not make one for yourself and one for a Hopi quilter? If you have another pattern you'd like to use, that's fine, too—a variety would be lovely! We will begin accepting pincushions (and other essential basic quilting supplies you might want to share) at the April meetings, because the first trip to deliver them will be about a week after the Guild meetings.

<u>Cutting</u> (for 2 pincushions with colors reversed from each other, layer two contrasting fabrics

together and cut both at the same time, as follows,):

One 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " square; cut in half diagonally (A)

Two 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2 1/8" rectangles (B)

One 2 3/8" square, cut in half diagonally (C)

One 1 5/8" square, cut in half diagonally (D)


One bias strip $\frac{3}{4}$ " \times 5" (handle, see below)

Borders and underside can be cut from a contrasting fabric, or one of the first two fabrics. For <u>each</u> pincushion, also cut:

Two border strips $1\frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 35/8$ " (E)

Two border strips $1\frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 51/8$ " (F)

One 5 1/8" square (underside of pincushion)



You'll also need polyester fiberfill or other suitable stuffing.

Use good, strong thread that doesn't break easily, and shorten machine stitch slightly. Don't skimp on the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, and make sure all stitching is secure, so it will withstand the stuffing process!

Lay out basket and background pieces, arranging them to shape the basket as shown. (If you have cut two different colored fabrics at the same time, you will be able to make two baskets, one of each color, with opposite backgrounds.)

Make handle first. Fold bias strip into thirds and press lightly. With a long stitch, baste down center of folded strip, keeping an even width. On the ironing board, shape strip into a handle and with tip of iron, coax and press it into a curve to fit onto the large background triangle (A). Pin handle to triangle at middle and ends, leaving about $\frac{1}{2}$ " of handle extending beyond lower edge of triangle. Remember to allow room for seams at upper edges of triangle. Go slow, and stitch handle in place (inner edge of curve first, then outer edge). Press gently. Stitch the triangle with handle on it to the basket triangle (A). Press seam toward basket. (Handle might also be made from rickrack, bias tape or other trim, or use your favorite method.)

Stitch basket "feet" triangles (D) onto side rectangles (B), taking care to keep them in the correct position so they make a flat bottom for the basket, and sew them to left and right sides of basket. Add the (C) triangle of background fabric to the bottom edge of basket, keeping it centered. (You will have a C triangle of each fabric left over, which you do not need for either basket.)

Add the shorter borders to two opposite sides. Press seams away from basket. Add the two longer borders and press. The corners can be left square, or they can be rounded or trimmed off slightly to make the pincushion easier to stuff. Mark around a spool to round off corners, or use a ruler to make a diagonal line across each corner.









Lay basket block on top of plain square of fabric, right sides together, lining up edges (they should be the same size; if not, make adjustments). Pin together, and stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from edges, leaving an opening about 2" on one side, for turning and stuffing. Trim off any excess fabric if corners have been remodeled; also trim off any loose threads. Turn cushion right side out, making sure corners and seams are coaxed out evenly. Press if needed. Stuff firmly, pushing stuffing tightly into corners first, with your finger or a stuffing stick (a chopstick works fine). Keep adding stuffing until it is evenly full and firm enough. Pin opening closed and stitch by hand. Embellish as desired!
