# Tucson Quilters Guild

**Deborah Gordon will be our featured speaker in July.** Her presentation, "Not for Warmth Alone," tells the history of several quilts and their quilt makers. She will also share quilts and their stories from her own collection. Throughout history, quilts were made for many reasons. As Deborah uses women's diaries, journals, letters, and stories, you will hear the voices of the women as they tell why they quilted and what quilting has meant to them.

Deborah's love of fabric, color, and pattern led her to a career in interior design, followed by 35 years of teaching needlework, patchwork, and quilting. Beginning in the 1970's, she has taught for the community college system in southern California and for quilt guilds, quilt conferences, quilt shops, and retreats throughout the United States.

As usual, there will be no workshops in July.

**Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame - Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson** The Tucson team documented 34 quilts at its first public documentation at the Arizona History Museum on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Some quilt owners were so interested; they have their names on the list for the next Tucson public documentation November 16<sup>th</sup>.

The group documented quilts from the mid 1800s to quilts made within the last two years. There were quilts from the turn of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the 1930s, and still others scattered throughout the decades. Also documented was a quilt with an opera theme depicting varied characters and including a score circling the quilt's perimeter. The group left the Museum tired, but exhilarated with the process.



Pattern of the Month – July 2013 by Evelyn George

### "Scrappy Stairway to the Stars"

12 12" blocks (finished size) 40" × 52" (finished size quilt, including 2" borders)

---Red, white and blue quilts are great anytime, especially for a patriotic holiday or for honoring our veterans. This one is so easy –it's made entirely from  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips!

#### Fabrics:

#### Assorted starry or dotted prints in reds and blues

(~  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yds. each R&B; or 17  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips of each.) White or gold, for small squares

 $(\sim 3/8 \text{ yd}; \text{ or } 5 \ 2\frac{1}{2}'' \times \text{WOF strips.})$ 

Backing - 1+ 5/8 yds. patriotic print

Note: <u>RESERVE</u> 5 strips of blue for borders <u>and</u> 5 strips of red for binding.

#### Cut 12 of each size from both reds and blues:

 $\begin{array}{ll} 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ squares} \\ 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ } \times 4\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ rectangles} \\ 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ } \times 6\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ rectangles} \\ 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ } \times 8\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ rectangles} \\ 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ } \times 10\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ rectangles} \\ & -- \mbox{ also}, \mbox{ Cut } \mbox{ 72 } 2\frac{1}{2}" \mbox{ squares from white} \end{array}$ 

Each block has 6 horizontal rows, as shown in block illustration:

Row  $1 - 10\frac{1}{2}$ " blue + white square Row  $2 - 8\frac{1}{2}$ " blue + white square +  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " red Row  $3 - 6\frac{1}{2}$ " blue + white square +  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " red Row  $4 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " blue + white square +  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " red Row  $5 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " blue + white square +  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " red Row  $6 - white square + 10\frac{1}{2}$ " red



Using  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances, sew the indicated pieces together into the 6 rows. Press seams toward red and blue (away from white). Sew rows into blocks. Make 12 identical blocks. Arrange into rows with 3 blocks across and 4 blocks down, rotating blocks as needed to form alternating diagonal stripes of red and blue, separated by white squares, as shown in illustration at top of page. Sew blocks together into rows; join rows. Measure quilt top, and add borders, using 5 reserved strips. Layer and quilt, bind with remaining 5 strips. (Note: other designs can also be made by rearranging the strips, or the blocks—have fun!)
