
We know her as a phenomenal "wearables" artist but at one time **Rami Kim** was a DNA scientist. She graduated from Seoul National University and the University of California at San Francisco with degrees in chemistry and molecular endocrinology. She then put her scientific talent to work for the Cancer Research Institute of California. But she soon realized that she would rather spend her time with beautiful fabrics, threads, and beads than with the DNA sequencing gels and radioactive isotopes of science. So she quit her job and devoted herself full time to her passion for fabric art.

Rami's first exposure to quilting was in 1996 when she took a free log cabin quilting class at her local fabric store. She learned other sewing techniques while making Barbie clothes for her two daughters completing 120 outfits in a single month. During her quilting career, Rami has accumulated 11 sewing machines, winning some and purchasing others. She jokingly shared that when she does her free-motion machine embroidery she threads all of her machines with a different color and moves from machine to machine so she doesn't have to change thread.

Rami's favorite technique is playing with 3-D textures and this month we are going to experience the myriad of designs she has developed from Korean fabric folding, to American smocking, to harlequin tucks, to pinwheels, to many more. We still have a few spots remaining in her 2-day workshop so please join us as we're sure you'll be eager to incorporate these techniques into your own quilting projects or wearables.

Does she ever regret leaving her biochemical research job? Not at all! She loves the freedom to spend her time creating whatever her heart desires. Rami and her husband are empty nesters now and she can sew anytime 24/7. At least until her daughters give her grandchildren that is......

Small Quilt Auction entries are due in November... I can hardly wait to get going with mine... but it's in the queue and not at the top yet.



French: To pedal in the sauerkraut = to spin your wheels - to go nowhere


PROGRAM NOTES

This and other back issues of Cloth Paper Scissors are now available as digital downloads—even the sold-out print issues.

Looking at past issues of quilt magazines can offer fresh inspiration. Nancy Green's "Stitching on Air" quilts was featured in the October/November 2012 issue of Quilting Arts Magazine. Her technique is a new way to create a cutwork embroidery look. I have this issue and would be glad to share it with anyone who wishes to view it. Betty Hayden Award: Quilt Show entries are due this month. If you've been quilting less than 3 years, you could be eligible for the Betty Hayden Award. Other requirements are that you did all the sewing yourself, (piecing, applique-if there is any, quilting-hand or machine, binding, etc.) and that this is the first time that you are entering a quilt in any quilt show.

Quilts do not need to be original designs, but as always, credit must be given to the designer and/or source of the pattern. You do not need to have your quilt judged by the professional judges at the show but this can be a useful source of comments to help you improve your quilting skills. And we've now had several of our new quilters win ribbons at the quilt show.

Quilts are displayed at our January Guild meeting and the Betty Hayden Award winner is selected by vote of all guild members present. A special ribbon will be awarded and hung with the winning quilt at the quilt show. For more information or questions please contact Alice Wilder (wilderonline@comcast.net).

Pattern of the Month - October 2013 by Evelyn George "Scrappy American Stars"

Tucson Quilters Guild finds many ways to give to our community, and a recent need has been for patriotic quilts to honor those who have served our country. This quilt is $40^{\circ} \times 52^{\circ}$, perfect for a small donation quilt, or a quick quilt for anyone on your gift list. Make the very easy star blocks in scrappy patriotic prints or colors of your choice, and try this simple half-drop setting for an interesting layout.

Yardage requirements:

Light background - 1³/₄ yards Dark star centers, borders and binding - 1 yard Assorted prints for star points - about ¹/₂ yard total (also need Backing - 1 5/8 yards)

Cutting:

<u>Light</u> - 80 4¹/₂" squares 4 6¹/₂" x 12¹/₂" rectangles (for half-drops) <u>Dark</u> - 10 4¹/₂" squares (star centers) 5 to 10 2¹/₂" x WOF strips (5 for borders and 5 for binding, if used) <u>Assorted prints</u> - 80 2¹/₂" squares (star points)

Star Blocks (12" finished size):

Line up a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " print square on top of one corner of a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " background square, *right sides together*, and stitch diagonally from corner to corner of the small square, as shown. (Note: you could draw the line first if you prefer.)

Trim off the corner, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press triangle open, toward the corner. Line up another (different) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " print square on the corner to the right of the first one, right sides together; stitch, trim and press as before. The background square now has 2 scrappy star points. \downarrow









Continue adding 2 scrappy star points each to a total of 40 background squares (the other 40 background squares will remain plain; they will be the *corners* of the blocks).

Arrange 1 center square, 4 star point units and 4 plain background squares to make the star as shown, right. Stitch together in rows; press seams toward plain squares. Join rows to form the star block. Make 10.



Quilt Assembly:

Arrange the star blocks into 3 *vertical* rows, with the half-drop rectangles at the top and bottom of the first and third rows. (Refer to illustration, top of page.)

Sew blocks together into the 3 rows and join rows to make the top. Measure length of top; piece strips to make two side borders this measurement and add to sides of quilt. Measure width of top, including the borders you just added; cut top and bottom borders this size and add. Quilt and finish as desired.
