

Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson

In November, documentation took a different direction. Terry Grzyb-Wysocki, Cathy Washburn, Judy Breneman, Bea Kabler, Kate Clark, Linda Laird, Susan Standley, Sandy Woods, Peggy Hazard, Sheryl Verts, and Sue Franklin began documenting quilts from the *100 years 100 Quilts* exhibit held at the *Arizona History Museum* last year. It was fascinating to see the quilts "close up and personal" and view one more time a piece of history. One creative quilter used 2012 1" squares to form the Arizona flag! Another used photo transfers from pictures of statues in locations throughout the state to create her quilt.

The team ultimately documented 95 of the 100 quilts. It was an amazing accomplishment and exciting to do. They will be entered in the Quilt Index as a group. The Centennial quilt will be documented later this year.

Attention Tuesday Evening Attendees

As a member of the Board of the Tucson Quilters Guild, I feel it incumbent of me to explain a statement made at the Tuesday night meeting in November. This regards the question of night Business meetings, and the need for volunteers from the Evening Meeting. In August, Marie Morris brought up the question of having evening Business meetings so that attendees of Tuesday night meetings could attend and would then be able to volunteer to fill Board/ Committee positions. We had a very lively debate about the pros and cons of going to 6 night meetings and 6 day Business meetings, alternating so that all could participate. I am afraid that a question that I posed to the Business meeting ended all the debate and that for now this question was tabled. My question to the 30 or so attendees of the Business meeting in August was: of those currently attending the Business meeting and holding Board/Committee positions, how many would not be willing to attend night meetings. Only half, that is to say 15 volunteers would be willing to continue to volunteer holding the vital positions that the Guild needs to function. That would mean, that while we are seeking volunteers to fill vacancies that will occur in March, we would need a volume of volunteers to fill all the positions that would be caused if night meetings were instituted. My query to the group attending the meeting was-do you think that we could fill this many positions? And with that the discussion was dropped and we went on to other business.

While we would like to include new people to fill Board/Committee positions, and we **would** welcome your help, would the evening attendees be willing to take over half of the positions currently filled by the morning attendees? If a flood of volunteers steps forward I feel certain that things would change. But having only one or two or three volunteers will **not** take the place of 10-15 morning meeting volunteers. Alas, I feel again that this issue involves numbers, which as your Treasurer I understand, but do you?

Pattern of the Month January 2014

Flip-a-Strip Scrappy Quilt ~40" x 60"


This quilt top is made entirely from $2\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF (~42") strips. You could use a precut roll of strips, or cut assorted ones from your stash. This quilt uses mostly dark strips with light accent squares. If your fabrics are mostly light, use bright or dark for the accent squares, instead. Have fun—the finished look will depend upon the fabrics you choose!

27 assorted dark or medium strips (patriotic prints shown)

5 white or gold strips (contrasting, for accent squares)

6 coordinating strips for binding (this quilt has no borders)

Backing about 42" x 63" (13/4 yards) (& batting about the same size)



*Note: if WOF after trimming off selvedges is less than $40\frac{1}{5}$ " on some of your strips, try cutting cut all of the pieces 13" in order to get 3 pieces from each WOF strip. (The quilt would then finish about 2" shorter.)

The <u>exact</u> length isn't critical, but all pieces need to be the <u>same</u> length.

Cut the white or gold into $2\frac{1}{2}$ squares (need 80).

Sew pieces right sides together using a 4" seam allowance.

Sew a square onto one end of each $13\frac{1}{2}$ piece; press each seam toward the square.

Sew 4 square + strip combinations together into a continuous length, so squares and strips alternate. (Press these seams toward the long strip; that will make them easier to match when sewing rows together.) This makes 20 identical long vertical rows. Each row needs to have a square at one end, but not the other. Sew the 20 rows together, flipping every other row in the opposite direction, so that one row begins with a square and the next doesn't.

Layer top, batting and backing. Quilt as desired; join binding strips together and bind using your favorite method to finish the guilt. Here's one method for a guick binding, done completely by machine:

Trim off backing and batting even with edges of quilt top. Use walking foot and a slightly longer stitch. Piece binding, fold lengthwise and press as usual; but sew it onto <u>back</u> of quilt first. Begin somewhere near the middle of any side. Leave the first 8" or so of binding free when you start. (Begin with about <u>3/8" seam allowance</u>, testing a short section to see if binding will cover the first stitching when it is folded over to the front. You might need to adjust seam allowance, depending on width of binding, thickness of batting, etc.) Stop 3/8" before each corner and fold the strip up so there is a 45 degree angle at the corner, and then back down, to miter in the usual manner.

Stop stitching about 10" to 12" before you reach your starting place. Join the two ends, using your favorite method, then finish sewing the joined section to edge of quilt. Fold binding around to front and stitch down with a straight or decorative stitch by machine. Aim to overlap the first stitching line just enough so that you can stitch close to the fold and be a tiny bit to the left of, or right on top of, the first stitching. It helps to use a bobbin thread that blends with both binding and backing; this stitching will show slightly on the back, but it is a very durable finish for donation quilts or any utilitarian quilt that will be washed a lot.
