Cathy Miller - The Singing Quilter



Of all the speakers who have visited Tucson over the past 2 years, Cathy Miller came to quilting in the most unusual way. In 1991 she was asked to write music for a play that was to be presented at that year's Quilt Canada in Ottawa. "I told her I wasn't a quilter and the producer said it didn't matter. Neither was the playwright!" But since she had researched and written music about other subjects, she decided she could do this too. She read books on quilting and followed quilters around shows, taking notes on how they spoke to each other. She took a quilt class and made her first quilt. And then she wrote the music for the play.

After that she went back to work as a singer, the primary focus of her life. But, the quilting bug had bitten. She made potholders to practice her piecing and made quilts for her nieces and nephews for their 19th birthdays. After meeting and marrying her husband John Bunge in 1998, the couple decided to take a trip to Australia where John, also a musician, got an 8 month job in Darwin. While there, Cathy attended a show of historic quilts. On display was "The Rajah Quilt", made in 1841 by female convicts aboard the ship Rajah on their trip from England to Tasmania. And there she found a story for yet another song about quilting. And the stories just kept coming. At the end of 8 months she had enough songs for a CD – songs that share quilt history, a song about the AIDS Memorial Quilt, personal stories about quilts made by mothers and grandmothers, and songs with a humorous edge.

But would anyone really be interested in buying a CD about quilting? Apparently so! Cathy has now produced 5 CDs of quilt songs and has travelled worldwide to perform these songs at quilt shows, retreats, and guilds always accompanied by her husband John who sings harmonies and plays the harmonica. In the meantime, Cathy has continued to develop her quilting skills even as she has expanded her singing repertoire and now offers workshops to accompany the show. Some of her quilts have won ribbons and she has had quilts juried into such shows as the International Quilt Festival in Houston so she has certainly come a long way in a very short time.

I met Cathy in Houston this past fall and watched as she brought the audience to tears and laughter while performing songs after each purchase of an Alzheimer quilt. She was the first speaker I hired after taking the gig as Program Chair and I hope you all enjoy the show and workshops!

Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson

The next public documentation is at the **Arizona History Museum on April 5th**. The Museum is located at 949 E. 2nd St, Tucson. For an appointment, contact azquilt doc@yahoo.com or call 480.395.4340. There is no fee, however, donations are appreciated. For documentation, the quilt owner first signs a release of information and then completes three pages of owner information (as much as possible).

The documentation team then carefully examines the quilt and enters the information obtained on to a seven page form. Photographs are taken of the quilt. The owner receives a cloth label with a number, unique to that documentation. The data ultimately is entered into the Quilt Index, an online database for quilts.

Also, *Centennial* quilt owners, if you have not already done so, please return the release and ownership information forms to Lynn Miller. Once Lynn has those forms, she will begin issuing the documentation quilt labels.

Arizona Quilt Documentation Project

Press Release January 27, 2014

Arizona Quilt Documentation Project Seeking Funding to Continue Digitizing and Uploading the Original Arizona Quilt Documentation to the Quilt Index

In 1995-1996 the original Arizona Quilt Project archived all of the data they collected on 2884 quilts with the Arizona Historical Society. One of the goals of the current Arizona Quilt Documentation Project is to add all of this data on the Quilt Index, a very big project. In 2013 all of the 2884 photos were digitized from the original slides, a major requirement to be included on the Quilt Index. Now the task is to transcribe all of the records.

The original Quilt Documentation Project team funded their project when they archived the 2884 quilts with \$5,000 with the Arizona History Museum (AHS) Papago, in Tempe, Arizona. The AHS library has generously helped us access these funds to use in hiring a qualified data entry person to transcribe all the hand written info into a spread sheet which will be sent directly to the Quilt Index.

A data entry person started in early January and is doing a wonderful job. She has estimated that the \$5,000 will complete about 800 quilts. The Arizona Quilt Documentation Project is now seeking additional funds to be sent directly to the Arizona Historical Society fund specifically for our project.

The AHS handles all payments. Also they have let us use a computer at the library and have been very supportive of this project. We are so pleased with how smoothly this project is going. But in order to get all the data held at the library we need more than \$10,000 to complete this enormous task. Any donation would help and is welcome. We are also in the process of applying for several grants, but we don't want to see this vital part of the project have to be put on hold.

Pattern of the Month March 2014

"Charms in the Window"

(12" finished block size)

Sometime when you need a quick gift, for a new baby or someone on your list, try this Log Cabin variation with a charm in each center square. Courthouse Steps construction makes it quick and easy. Whatever the fabric style, it's alternating Light and Dark rounds that make the pattern. One set of blocks has a Dark center and outer round, and the other set has a Light center and outer round. The two types of blocks are alternated to make the layout shown at right. You could use a different fussy-cut motif in each block center, for a charming effect.

Dark Block



Cut:

One $4\frac{1}{2}$ " center square (Dark)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (Light)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " (Light)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " (Dark)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $12\frac{1}{2}$ " (Dark)

Light Block



One $4\frac{1}{2}$ " center square (Light)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (Dark)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " (Dark)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " (Light)
Two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $12\frac{1}{2}$ " (Light)



Shown above: 20 blocks
(10 Dark and 10 Light)
+ 2" borders = Quilt ~52" \times 64"

Both sets of blocks are made by adding strips one round at a time, using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Start with the center square, its motif oriented the way you want (boy standing upright, for example). Add rounds as follows:

Dark Block: To Dark center, add Light strips to left and right side first, then to top and bottom, to make the first round. Continue by adding Dark strips in same order, to make the second round.

Light Block: To Light center, add Dark strips to top and bottom first, then to sides, to make first round. Add Light strips in same order, to make second round.

The reason for adding strips in a different order on Light and Dark blocks is so that when you alternate them in the quilt, each *seamed* edge will be sewn to an *unseamed* one, meaning no seams need to be matched around the outside edges of blocks. Of course it's not absolutely necessary to do it this way, it just makes it easier!

(If all your fabrics are non-directional, the light and dark blocks can be made using the same sequence (whichever is most convenient); blocks can then simply be rotated so that a seamed edge is always sewn to an unseamed one.)

The quilt above uses 20 blocks, 10 Dark and 10 Light, alternated checkerboard fashion. Borders are cut from $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide strips of fabric. To make a different size quilt, make as many blocks as you need, adding more borders if you wish. Blocks finish at 12" square, so it's easy to figure out how big your quilt will be. This simple block is great in any style of fabric. How about totally scrappy? Just maintain relative light/dark differences between the rounds!
