Jane Sassaman



After a varied career in the design world, Jane began to quilt in 1980. She found that these “soft paintings” satisfied the draftsman, the craftsman and the artist in her. Consequently, she is now a dedicated (some say “obsessed”) quilt artist and fabric designer.

Her art quilts have been shown in many national and international exhibits, including Quilt National 1989 through 2005 and Contemporary American Quilts, the first major exhibit of American art quilts in England. Her quilt “Willow” was named as One of the One Hundred Best American Quilts of the Century. Jane is also the author of “The Quilted Garden”. The book includes twenty years of her work and exercises for making nature-inspired quilts.

Jane’s love for historic decorative arts can be seen in all facets of her work, but it is especially evident in the exuberant fabric she is currently designing for FreeSpirit. Her designs are oversized and colorful and have been coined as “William Morris on anti-depressants”. They are created for quilts, wearables and home decorating. Her latest book, Patchwork Sassaman Style, beautifully illustrates her fabric “in action”.

May's Featured Quilter... Evelyn George

Evelyn George is a wonderful choice for the *Mother's Day* month's featured Guild member. She's Mom to 5 and stepmom to 4, and credits her own mother as her inspiration for her many accomplishments.

Raised on a farm in the San Joaquin Valley in California, Evelyn and her brother grew up working hard and at times, making do. She credits her mother with being able to do anything:

cooking and baking; hunting with her dad; designing and making clothing; and flying an airplane! Evelyn always strove to be as "accomplished" as her mother. Eventually, she realized she'd made it...

Evelyn's education was wonderfully eclectic! Starting out in a fine arts college, finances dictated that she transfer to a state school. While there she took the classes that interested her. One of her favorites was an Architecture class, but Ceramics, Photography, Music and various Art classes rounded out her academic experience. She never stopped going to school either, taking classes when she could at local venues where she lived.



Designing things has always been important in Evelyn's life. All her life she wanted to know how things were put together. Her first custom sewing job was making a pair of bell-bottomed trousers out of a rust colored, wide-wale corduroy, for a "hippy" in Taos, NM, back in the day!

Fast forward to today! One of the most visible "Hats" that Evelyn wears in our Guild is the Designer of the Pattern of the Month! Scrappy, practical, versatile, these patterns inspire us and help us make some inroads into our stashes. But there's more!

Evelyn was the first TQG member inducted into the Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame, back in 2008.

And, of course, there's the Quilt for a Cause organization that she's been involved with since its inception. QFAC is an incorporated non-profit that raises funds to fight breast and gynecological cancer locally. This is an incredibly successful group that TQG is affiliated with and will have its story in the Newsletter later in the year.

Evelyn joined TQG in 2000 and "jumped right in!" She joined Bees, and worked in various capacities with the Show Committee. But what she really wanted to do was design! She let it be known and when the opportunity came up, she volunteered as co-chair for Block of the Month, where for the past 12 years she's been able to do what she loves best.

Evelyn's "style" of quilting is scrappy and she aims to make patterns that are 'doable' for beginning and intermediate quilters. She, like many of us, comes from a 'sewing' background, though her great-grandmother made quilts and she slept under one as a child.

Her first quilt was made when her first child was four years old, to ease the transition to the big girl bed, making room for the new baby. It was made of a combination of anything available, including scraps of corduroy, with a sheet for the backing! Remember those days? The quilt is no longer around; loved hard and long, it finally fell apart. But, all of her 7 grandchildren have a quilt that they helped make, and her daughter has some blocks from her great grandmother that Evelyn hopes to help her put together one day soon, making a quilt that spans 5 generations.

What inspires Evelyn? Fabric, nature, ideas, photos, phrases, friends...

TQG is so lucky to have this talented and generous woman, who shares her ideas and love of humanity with us!

A number of quilts are layered on a bed, often in the order of the date made. The quilts are "turned" and held up one at a time for the viewers to see while a lecturer talks about each one."

The Tucson team documented 25 very different quilts, including a mid-19th century “Princess Feather,” a unique (many symbols) summer spread on loan from a museum, art quilts, including one with a “Cochise” theme, a Hawaiian bed quilt, a lace edged silk Crazy from the late 1800s, and a darling appliqué quilt with a *Quilt Fiesta* theme. Of course there were others to complete the eye candy collection of the day.

Pattern of the Month - May 2014

"Gypsy Coins" - 40" x 50"

LAP SIZE -perfect for a charity quilt! Make one for giving, or if you just love scrappy, make it for yourself. Use assorted prints for the coin rows, which are quickly made from strip sets.

Directions are given for using either full width of fabric (WOF) strips, or half-strips cut from fat quarters (FQ's).

Fabrics


9 assorted 4" x WOF strips (OR 5 FQ's) (for coins)

(9 different fabrics are shown here, but repeats are OK)

1 1/4 yards sashing and border fabric

1 1/2 yards backing fabric (42" x 54")

(no binding needed if quilt is enveloped)



Cutting

Cut one 4" x WOF strip each from 9 assorted fabrics (need 9 strips total);

if using Fat Quarters, cut them into 4" x 20" strips (need 18 total).

Cut the sashing and border fabric lengthwise into 6 strips 4 1/2" wide x 45" long (they will be trimmed to exact lengths later).

Sewing: The "coin" rows are made from strip sets.

Using the 9 assorted strips, make 3 strip sets with 3 strips in



each set. Press seams in one direction. (If using shorter strips, from FQ's, make 6 strip sets.)

Cut strip sets into 8 1/2" wide sections (4 per strip set, total of 12 from all 3 sets).

(If using FQ's, you'll only get 2 sections per strip set, total of 12 from all 6 sets.)

Combine 4 assorted sections to make a scrappy vertical row of "coins"; make 3 rows with 12 coins in each). See quilt illustration, top of page.

Alternating 4 sashing strips and 3 coin rows, sew vertical rows together. (This includes the side borders, which are the same size as the sashing strips.) Trim ends to straighten and even them up. Add top and bottom borders last. Trim corners to square them up.

To finish the quilt using the envelope method, layer in this order:

1. Batting 2. Backing (right side up) 3. Quilt Top (right side down, facing the backing)

Pin together around edges, and stitch 1/4" from edge of quilt top, leaving an 8" opening for

turning. Trim off excess batting and backing, turn right side out, with batting inside. Stitch

opening closed. Topstitch 1/4" around edges. Tie or tack layers together at intervals of about 4"

apart.

---Or, if you prefer, layer, quilt and bind in the usual manner.
