HOLIDAY BLOCK EXCHANGE! It's almost here - our Holiday Block exchange to take place at our December meetings. It's not too late to get started if you haven't made your block yet!

All members are encouraged to participate and join in the fun. The more the merrier! Make a 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished block with a holiday theme. It can be appliqued, pieced, embroidered, fused - you decide. On the back, attach a muslin scrap marked:

Made by	[your name]
Owner	[leave blank
Date	

Roll it around a paper towel or similar tube and wrap it in colorful paper. When you bring a block you get to exchange yours for another. You will vote for your favorites. Winning blocks will be hung at the Quilt Fiesta! Join the fun!

President's Block (6½" unfinished size) (Shhh! Don't tell Reilly ---it's a surprise!)

It's a TQG tradition to present our outgoing President with a block shower, so next February, when Reilly Zoda finishes her 2 years as President, let's make "Cat in the Barn Door" blocks for her –she loves cats!





Also, her favorite colors are blue and green. Make yours with either a light or dark background, arranging colors as you choose.

Cut:

2½" square "cat" fabric (center)

1½" x 12" strip each "frame" color and background color (for side units)

Two 3" squares **each** of background color and a contrasting color (for corner triangle square units)

Side Units: Piece the two 12" strips together lengthwise; press seam toward darker fabric.

Cut into 2½" x 2½" sections (need 4, for side units).





<u>Corner Units</u>: On *wrong* side of the *lighter* two 3" squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place light square on top of dark square, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from drawn line, on both sides of line. Cut apart on drawn line and press open, pressing seams to dark. Square up to $2\frac{1}{4}$ ", trimming carefully so seam ends remain at corners of the square.

Repeat with second set of light/dark 3" squares, to make total of 4 triangle squares.









Make total of 4

To make block, place cat square in center, and position corner and side units so background fabric (light or dark) is on outer edges of block all the way around (see block illustrations, top of page). Sew together in 3 rows, and join rows together to make the block.

There will be a slideshow of all the quilts (available to watch on television or a computer).





Arizona Quilt Documentation Project - Tucson

At its **November Documentation Training session**, the Tucson team had Lynn Miller, the lead *Quilt Index* person for the *Arizona Documentation Project* as its special guest. Lynn provided insight into the process used to get the information into the *Quilt Index*. She told the group how it began with the owner forms and continued with the documentation itself, through the entire system, until finally, the information is housed in the *Quilt Index*.

She has a state wide team of volunteers to help her with this. Lynn works with five documents at a time. First, information goes to Kora, a data base for number, date, location, owner's name, and photo. Kora generates a number which Lynn records on a master sheet and then scans the document as a PDF file in her computer, renames it, usually with the document numbers. Her team is invaluable in helping with the process.

The Tucson team is invaluable, too, and **we welcome new members**. It is a rewarding and exciting experience. Pattern of the Month - December 2014

Recycled Jeans Pocket

Do you recycle your family's jeans into quilts, aprons or other useful things? Here's a fun way to use the pockets. Embellish as much as you want, add a ribbon for carrying or hanging, and you have a cute tiny "purse" for a little girl, a gift card holder, or a holiday pocket to hang in any room.

This method works for pockets which are stitched on the back of jeans, without rivets or flaps: Carefully remove pocket by cutting stitching between pocket and pants with sharp snips or a single edge razor blade. Be sure to cut away from yourself, like Mama told you, and put down your sharp



instrument whenever you feel the urge to tug on the pocket to loosen the stitching. Once you have pocket safely removed, use an old toothbrush to remove loose threads and any lint or grit hiding inside the folds.

A piece of tape is useful to pick up loose bits.

Make a new pocket back as follows: fold a piece of fabric in half, right sides together, and lay pocket, with its outer edges still pressed under, on top of fabric, and upper edge of pocket lined up with fold. There should be at least $\frac{1}{2}$ " beyond pocket around sides and bottom. Mark around sides and bottom, following pocket edge, making it a little bigger than





the pocket itself; this will be your stitching line. Pin the two thicknesses of fabric together, marking an opening on one side for turning. Stitch on line, remembering to leave opening. Trim seam allowance to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and clip corners slightly to reduce bulk. Turn right side out, and press, folding seam allowances inside opening. Set aside.

Embellish the pocket front with holiday appliques, lace, rickrack, doilies, buttons, beads, woven trim, little ribbon flowers, embroidery, etc. Most of this is easiest to do before pocket and back are joined together; just leave yourself room around the edges to stitch layers together. Try not to add any more thickness at the upper corners, as that is already the thickest place to sew through, and the ribbon handle will be attached there, also. (Of course if the pocket was originally embellished, you can add more if you like!)

If you want to insert lace or ruffles around bottom and sides of pocket, baste it in position on reverse side of pocket front before joining front and back together. Lace or trim can also be stitched along the upper edge of pocket. Lace cutouts or appliques can be fused or pinned in place and stitched with matching or contrasting thread by hand or machine. Buttons, flowers etc. can be stitched by hand.

To finish the pocket, cut a length of ribbon or cord as long as you want for handle, stitch ends inside upper corners of pocket front. Lay front on top of back and pin in place. Using matching or contrasting thread, stitch around sides and bottom edges, following original stitching marks and backstitching at beginning and end.
