Katie's easy, energetic manner has made her a very popular teacher and lecturer. When not in residence at her studio in Santa Fe she travels

the world presenting her contemporary quilting theories and techniques to classes, not only in North America, but in Europe, the Far East, Australia and New Zealand. Awards and accolades have been numerous for Katie, culminating with her 2005 induction into a very select group of art quilt professionals who have earned the *Silver Star Award* presented by Houston Quilt Festival.

A prolific author, Katie shares her enthusiasm for the art of creative quilting through her numerous books, her many classes, and now as a member of the Experius Academy Advisory Council as they work to develop the art mission for the new Gateway Canyons Resort in Colorado - a destination resort for quilting enthusiasts and fiber artists: also host of Katie's Alegre Retreats. As busy as she is, her love of the art and support of her family give her tireless energy. Look for many exciting new works to come from Katie in the next year.



Wow, what a show! You know now that the vintage quilt turning had 15 fantastic quilts. Here are some highlights. You saw "best" quilts such as the 1854 appliquéd *Cherry Wreath* and the pieced 1873 *Harrison* quilt. Utility quilts, such as *Fred's Spools* and *Rectangle Sample* were present, too.

You saw perfect fussy cutting with a *Grandmother' Flower Garden*, and next viewed a less familiar flower garden, called *Martha Washington's*. A *Tulip in a Pot* provided strong contrast to an exceptional *Yo-Yo* quilt. Each bed covering had a story. Eight owners who had quilts documented learned even more about their quilts.

Pattern of the Month – February 2015 <u>Sunflower Block</u> designed by Hope Johnson

Hope Johnson of the Champlain Valley Quilt Guild in Vermont, and Dr. Diana Sammataro, a retired bee researcher and current member of Tucson Quilters Guild, are asking quilters in their guilds to partner in support of sustainable livelihoods in Ethiopia by making a Bees for Development Sunflower Quilt. This quilt will be used as a fundraiser to help establish a beekeeping center in Ethiopia. Bees For Development is a nonprofit organization which provides beekeeping training and marketing of related products to enable



poor communities develop their own sustainable income and improve their standard of living (for project details and more about BfD please visit beesfordevelopment.org.)

Tucson Guild members who would like to make an appliqued sunflower block for this quilt are asked to turn it in to Evelyn George at the <u>February</u> Guild meetings, or mail by March 3, 2015 to: Hope Johnson, P.O. Box 674, Shelburne, VT 05482.

Sunflower Applique Block Pieces (5 total):

Sunflower:

Two circles, A and B, and two 6-pointed petal shapes, C and D

Use solid or small-scale patterned warm yellow, yellow-orange and or medium browns and beige (no red, no neon, or day-glo hues).

Background:

One 8" x 8" square Use <u>solid</u> light to medium shade primary blue hue (no blue-green, no blue-violet).

Guidelines:

Use all cotton fabrics. Sunflower fabrics can be solid and/or patterned.

If you would like to fussy cut, petals can be made individually.


Match the center of the petal shape with the center of the square. Applique using any technique you prefer. Use only lightweight fusible stabilizer (Wonder Under, Steam-a-Seam Lite), please. No raw edges without stitches.

Fabric can be stamped, painted, and embellished with embroidery, machine or hand stitches, just stay within the lines of the petals -background is to remain solid blue color. No buttons, please.

Suggestion: Templates don't always print accurate size – Please use the measurements as a guide if adjustments are needed. Don't make flower any bigger than 4" --and center the flower on the 8" blue background; Hope will recut blocks into hexagon shapes for the quilt. (See sketch below.) Thanks! --Evelyn
