Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson

The Tucson team welcomed new member, Ruth Anderson in June. After a brief business meeting, the continuing education segment provided information about Ruby Short McKim, a prolific designer from the early 20th century. Team member, Bea Kabler began the discussion in May with two quilts using Quaddy Quilties, a newspaper pattern from a McKim's first series design in 1916. Sue Franklin continued the tale, bringing the *Bible History* quilt, another McKim series quilt from 1927. In both Bea's and Sue's quilts, the characters or events were angular shapes, typical of the Art Deco period.

The group documented Bea's *Quaddy Quilties*, in May and in June, two quilts that Cathy Washburn's grandmother made, an *8 pointed star* and a *Postage Stamp*. Also, both Rachel Lyman's beautifully fussy cut *Mourning* quilt and Sue Franklin's first quilt, a hand pieced and quilted *Sampler* were documented.

May provided more unique documentation experiences at the *Arizona History Museum*. On May 7th, 19 quilts were examined and on the 19th, another 15 from the Museum's collection. There were quilts ranging from the oldest, an *Oak Leaf and Reel* (with ties to Arizona), dated and signed 1855 to the latest, titled *Warmth of Patriotism* and dated 2001.

Three other quilts had strong Arizona connections. One was a *Star of Lemoyne* doll quilt, complete with doll, circa 1850 – 1875. The doll quilt and doll had been sent from the east by a doting grandmother to a child living in Arizona. The second with an Arizona connection was a *Cigar Store Premiums/Tobacco Flannels* with Indian motifs; circa 1902-29. The third, another Arizona treasure by Goldie Tracy Richmond, *Rodeo* quilt or *Cowboys at Play*.

In the midst of these unique quilts were many *Crazies* (unfortunately, most with deteriorating silks) and *Log Cabins* (varied settings and time periods). Many other pieced and appliquéd quilts were documented. It's like Christmas working with the *Museum* quilts. One never knows what Laraine Daly Jones will pull from the box for the next documentation table!

Pattern of the Month – July 2015 By Evelyn George

Hearts Across America 50" × 62"


Make this throw-sized quilt for your favorite American hero, in patriotic fabrics. Start with easy strip sets to make the heart blocks, then alternate them with plain squares to create this diagonal chain of hearts. Can you imagine it also in pastels, for a special little sweetheart? Simple quilting lines can be used to round the heart shape.

Fabric Requirements for 50" x 62" quilt:

Red: 1-1/4 yards (hearts, inner border, outer corners, binding) Blue w/white stars: 1/4 yard ("links" joining hearts together) White: 1-7/8 yards (background) Multicolor patriotic Print or Stripe: 3/4 yard (outer border)

Strip Sets (for Heart Blocks):

Cut *two* 4½" x WOF (42") strips of Red Cut *four* 4½" x WOF strips of White Cut *two* 2½" x WOF strips <u>each</u> Red, White, Blue





Backing: about 3 yards

Plain Squares:

Cut 31 6½" squares White Cut 4 3½" squares Red

---Use accurate ¼" seam allowances for best results. Press seams toward the dark.---Sew indicated strips together to make the strip sets shown below. Make 2 of <u>each</u> strip set. Subcut all sets into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " slices (16 per strip set; need 32 of <u>each</u>):





--Join 1 of each together to make a Heart Block↓



Make 32 Heart Blocks. Alternating Hearts with Plain Squares, arrange in rows as shown in quilt illustration, top of page. Sew blocks together into rows; join rows to make quilt center. Red Inner Border: Cut 6 strips 1½" x WOF and add to quilt, piecing as needed. Stripe or Print Outer Border: Cut 6 strips 3½" x WOF and add, placing the Red 3½" squares in the corners. Red Binding: Cut 6 strips 2½" x WOF; add after quilting.
