Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson By Sue Franklin

July 23rd marked the 4th time the Tucson team documented quilts at the *Arizona History Museum*. To date, the team has documented 73 *Museum* quilts. We saw a number with Arizona connections.

We saw a *Crazy*, in fair condition and inscribed with 1885 and 1887, varied initials, and "Viva la independencia." The makers were Tucson pioneers. Another late 19th century quilt, a *Lincoln Log Cabin* was made with silk ties and ribbons by the Postmistress of Madera Canyon. She stitched the quilt while living with her in-laws; her husband was fighting in the Spanish American War.

Another Tucson connection was a *Double Wedding Ring*, circa 1930-49, made by a "snowbird" with fabric purchased at a Tucson department store. However, one a more interesting story comes from Tombstone. An ad hoc group of theater performers were imprisoned in the newly built Tombstone jail. The prisoners made a *Log Cabin, Courthouse Steps* for Sheriff Will J Ward and his wife, expecting their second daughter in 1883. The child, Belle, didn't live to adulthood, but sister Lola kept the quilt and donated it to the Museum.

A final quilt with an Arizona connection is a mid 20th century *Crazy*. This quilt likely began in the early part of that century but had numerous patches from later times. The maker's family was originally from Mexico, but moved to Tucson about 1896.

Scattered throughout these Arizona quilts were some remarkable gems. One was a glorious *Fan* quilt, dated 1917 with embroidery so exquisite it looked like a machine did the work. Also, each fan was anchored by tightly puffed rosettes, made with variegated embroidery thread. For the first time, the group documented a *Nine Patch Pillowcase with a Button Closure* from the last quarter of the 19th century. Since those are more likely found in the east, especially Pennsylvania, it was a rare treat.

It's always a pleasure to describe treasures abounding in the Museum boxes. A pity many are too fragile to display. The team is blessed to have a close look on documentation days!

The team had other pleasures at the August meeting. Continuing education for the day included a review of Anne Champe Orr (1875-1946), wealthy socialite but astute business woman who was a prolific needlework and quilt designer. She's best known today for quilts of the 1930s and 1940s that combine needlework with traditional patchwork.

Quilts documented ranged from Rachel Lyman's *First* quilt to *Back Home Again* that Kate Clark began in 2006 and finished the week prior, to a circa 1930, hand appliquéd and quilted *Daffodil with Bows*, owned by Sue Franklin. Cathy Washburn had two beauties, *Civil War Crossing* and *Kitty*. Sandy Woods brought her *Nottingham* while Joyce Harrison offered a bride's quilt, *Summer Solstice*. Plans for next time include learning more about types of hand quilting.

Pattern of the Month - September 2015 By Evelyn George

Happy Birds

7" finished block

Whether you love to feed them in your yard, or know someone who likes birds, these little "Happy Birds" might be perfect for a special quilt. Just one or two could decorate a tote bag, pillow or wherever you would like to put them. The birds shown have a bright colored body with a black and white wing, with embroidered feet and a French knot eye. They are quick to make, with easy fusible applique and a little stitching by machine or hand. Doesn't that make you happy?

Materials for one block

One $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square background fabric Scraps for body and wing Wonder Under paper-back fusible Black embroidery thread (or fabric)



Quilt approx. 42" x 42"

Iron-on, tear-away stabilizer, for machine stitching

Trace body and wing separately onto paper side of fusible. Roughly cut out shapes leaving about $\frac{1}{4}$ " outside drawn lines. Following manufacturer's directions, fuse onto wrong side of selected fabrics. Allow to cool completely, then cut out on lines and remove paper. Arrange body and wing on background

square, right sides up, leaving room to add feet. Cover with damp pressing cloth and fuse. When cool, stitch around shapes by machine or hand, using stitch of choice. Add eye and feet as desired, either with stitching or fusible method.

Note: When using fusible applique, tracing the shapes as shown → will result in a bird that faces to the right. To have bird facing left, hold pattern up to window or over a light box and trace from reverse side. A fused bird will end up being mirror image of the one traced!
