We distributed:

230 Stockings, 250 pillowcases and 5 quilts to Candlelighters (supporting the families of Pediatric Cancer) I remember when this started we only needed 150 pillowcases...look how much it has grown!

27 Quilts and 100 Pillowcases to Peppi's House (TMC Hospice for all ages)

45 pillowcases, 45 stockings and 5 quilts to Family Loving Kare (6 local Adult Care homes)

6 bags of toiletries were distributed to Emerge! (Domestic Abuse Shelter)

Our efforts are going to head in a slightly different direction this next year. The stocking size for Candlelighters will be smaller, so a new pattern will be uploaded to the website, and new kits will be available.

We DO ask for the following prints for the stockings and pillowcases for the kids: ALL age youth prints, novelty prints, and bright colors. Think cheerful and fun!

The stockings do not need to be out of Christmas or holiday prints.

Peppi's House has also asked for Red/White/Blue 'Patriotic' Pillowcases. They go through approximately 100 a year. Kits for those will be available.

Our toiletries will now go to Emerge! Sadly the size we have provided in the past is no longer wanted by Youth On Their Own.

Every organization we distribute to is so thankful and humbled by our donations! You can all be proud that Tucson Quilters Guild supports our Community in such a giving way.


Quilt For A Cause

We sold patterns, pillowcases and raffle tickets at the Tucson Quilt, Craft and Sewing Expo, and then presented a trunk show for the Pieciful Quilters Retreat held by Eagles Wings Quilting. We had a great time at both events, and were delighted to receive 4 beautiful quilts made by last year's retreat attendees, and this year they have started another one for the upcoming auction! Thanks, quilters and Tim and Dina at Eagle's Wings, for being so supportive of Quilt For a Cause!

As you put the final touches on your Quilt Fiesta show entry, if you're undecided about what to do with your beautiful quilt, you might want to consider donating it to Quilt For a Cause after the show. The auction coming up next year in October is our 5th one. We have raised nearly \$800,000 so far, and with your help, we're well on our way to a million dollars!

Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson

In November, the team welcomed newest member, Sara Rumbaugh to her first meeting. Linda Laird provided continuing education by reviewing her extensive collection of fabrics. She included woven fabrics that were solid, checked, plaid, and striped. The stripes and plaids included some very old, circa 1860, while the others ranged from 1880-1920.

Her prints included florals with some wide ombres circa 1830-1860 and others from as recently as century later. The geometrics were fun and included dots, circles, stars, commas, and eccentrics, ranging from 1860 to the 1960s. Linda freely shared her knowledge as she reviewed those as well as some shirtings, feedsacks (fabric must have the "holes" on the edge), and mourning prints. She also had examples of cheater cloth; something commonly used today as well as in the middle of the 19th century.

Sara was oriented to the documentation process and also aided experienced members in documenting four quilts. These included Sue's sister *Carla's 60th Birthday* quilt, a nine patch and redwork piece; Rachel's friend Gloria's quilt *The Girls* (they even wore earrings), Terry's appliquéd and trapunto *Daisy* medallion quilt that she purchased on eBay; and finally, Kate's *1939 Nosegay*, a quilt made from blocks her mother made when she was 16 years old. Kate found the patches during a move and decided to put them together and then complete the quilt.

Pattern of the Month - December 2015

How To Create a Snowy Tree Block

Here's a tutorial on how to free-cut a fusible-backed fabric triangle into several "tiers" for a whimsical tree to applique onto your holiday block or quilt. You can make a charming tree from just one fabric, or you can combine several different greens or holiday prints to make it even jollier, like the scrappy table runner/wall hanging shown. Instructions are for making several blocks -- they're so much fun, you might want to make a bunch!

12½" background squares of white snowflake print (or other tone-on-tone white)

3 or 4 8" squares (*or 6" x 8" rectangles*)* of assorted green prints

6" square of brown for tree trunks

Wonder Under® or other paper-backed fusible of your choice

Fusing: To protect your ironing surface, cover it with an applique pressing sheet or a piece of baker's parchment paper. Cut paper-backed fusible slightly smaller than selected green and brown fabric pieces for trees. Following manufacturer's instructions, iron fusible side of Wonder Under to wrong side of those fabrics.

Cut each green rectangle or square into a triangle, as shown.

--**A wide, squat triangle, made from a rectangle, stretches up to make a nice fat tree.*

--*A tall triangle, made from a square, stretches up to make a taller, skinnier tree.*

For scrappy look, use either all squares, OR all rectangles.

Starting at side of triangle, use scissors to make a wavy cut across the top of the triangle to the other side. This can be at a slight angle, for a more realistic effect. →

Make two or three more wavy cuts, dividing the triangle into several "tiers" of the tree; trim the bottom edge wavy, also. Repeat with all the green triangles.

Play with the assorted tiers, mixing up the greens, or match them, as you like, positioning them on the white background, with some white "snow" showing between the pieces, to make trees.

Round off the sharp corners, trim and reshape tiers as needed to make them look their best.

Cut stems from the brown to go with your trees. Round these off a little, too.

Remove paper backing from all the cut pieces, reposition them on background square (remembering to leave room for seam allowances), and fuse according to manufacturer's directions.

Stitch around all the shapes with a straight stitch 1/8" from raw edges, or use zigzag, blanket stitch or other decorative stitch by machine or hand. Add embellishments if you wish.

Combine blocks into a wall hanging or table runner by adding sashing and borders; make a pillow from one; or add some to a holiday quilt. (*Scraps with fusible on them can be used to embellish other projects.*)
