


I just want to thank all of the members who participated in this effort last year.

Why Should YOU Enter a Quilt in the TQG Quilt Fiesta! Show?

We in the Tucson Quilters Guild have a wonderful opportunity to "show off" our quilts to our friends, those in the Guild, and others we know – be it church friends, work associates, walking companions, family, etc. To enter our show you need only to be a member of the guild. Quilt Fiesta! 2017 is not a juried show and you don't even have to have a quilt judged. (But having a quilt judged is a rewarding, fun, and an educational experience. More about this later.)

In order to have a quilt show, we must have quilts. People come to the quilt show to look at the quilts. People we know want to see our work; other quilters want to see our work. The quilt show is full of encouragement for Guild members, as well as other quilters and non-quilters. Being part of the quilt show may motivate us to do a technique that we've never tried before. Or maybe you have a quilt that is ready to be quilted, but you just have no idea how to quilt it. Seeing a quilt similar to yours, with quilting you like, may just be the inspiration you have been looking for. We can get all sorts of ideas about patterns to try, colors to put together, and quilting techniques. And just think, maybe someone will like your quilt and be inspired to just try quilting— or get motivated to get out that UFO quilt and finish it. They may see a technique, use of color or a new pattern from your quilt that will be just what they needed to either finish a quilt or start a new one.

Having decided to enter Quilt Fiesta!, your next decision is to have your quilt judged or not. Our judges do not come here to be critical of our work. They tell us what they like about our quilts; they give us suggestions of what to do to make our quilts better. Personally, I have found that even before they tell me what I need to do to improve, I usually already know. Their suggestions reinforce my desire to actually take their advice.

if you have not done so in the past, I hope that you will consider entering a quilt in the 2017 Quilt Fiesta! We do need quilts in order to have a show, and we would like to have any and all of your quilts. There will be such a variety of sizes, styles and colors. We need everyone to "show off" their quilts so people will be overwhelmed with our talents and workmanship — and be inspired!





Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson By Sue Franklin

At the April meeting, the team welcomed two new members, Glorya Anderson and Tama White. Judy Breneman presented continuing education using the topic "Clues in the Quilt." She used Sue's intergenerational quilt, a \$5 find with a late 19th century top and aback and binding from the 1930s as well as a review of colors, especially reds and greens and their changes over time.

The team documented four quilts. First was Terry's **Sunrise-Sunset** lovely raw edge appliqué, followed by Sue's **Baltimore Album** beauty. The third and fourth quilts were from Peggy's migrant quilt collection. The project began when varied clothing scraps and embroidered pieces were found as volunteers were cleaning up a wash. Varied people made these nontraditional quilts. Seeing the quilts and thinking of the persons who once wore the clothing or owned the embroidered pieces but lost them while trying to cross the border brought tears to our eyes.



In March, the team was honored to document 16 *Quilts for a Cause* original design quilts. Guild members demonstrated their skill in design, including numerous by Evelyn George such as **Scraphunter's Star** (the first in the collection), **Scraphunter's Star 2**, and **Falling Stars**; Kenci Lewis's **Around the Town and All Around Asia**; Jean Biddick's **Arizona Footprints**; and Dorothy Lee's design, **Twisting Through Asia** that added to the Asian influence. Former Guild speaker J Michele Watts was so impressed with *Quilts for a Cause* that she designed, made, and quilted **Tucson Tapestry** for the group. This is a sample of the quilts, but very impressive!





- 4. Assemble top and bottom rows:
 - Cut 16 3½" x 6½" pieces of Background. You will use 6 for top and bottom rows.
 - Use Clue 4 figure D pieces to make 2 of the following:



- Sew one on top matching Fabric 2.
- Flip the other one and sew on bottom matching Fabric 2.
- 5. Assemble side rows:
 - Use 10 Background pieces 3½" x 6½" and Clue 4 Figure C pieces to make 2 of the following:




- Sew one on the left, matching Fabric 1's.
- Sew the other on the right, matching Fabric 1's.


Your top is finished and you can add borders.

- I used Fabric 3 as my first border (cut $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide).
- Fabric 1 or 2 can be second border (cut 4½" wide) (OR, you may do as you please.)

Pattern of the Month - May 2016 "Little Gathered Basket"


It only takes a few scraps of fabric and batting to make a cute little basket, perfect for holding candies or small sewing things. I tried several different techniques for making these, and here's my favorite. With or without a handle, wouldn't one (or a set) of these make a charming and useful gift?



Cut two 8" circles of fabric (one for outside, one for lining), and one 8" circle of batting (I cut around a bowl with my rotary cutter--don't tell!) Also cut one $2\frac{1}{4}$ " \times 14" rectangle of fabric for the binding. (Leftover pieces of folded quilt binding could be used.)

Layer circle of batting between circles of fabric, with **both right sides out**. Pin to hold layers together.

With a long double thread, run a gathering stitch around circle through all layers, $\frac{1}{4}$ " from raw edges. Don't knot; leave ends of thread for pulling gathers. Mark the four quarters of the circle by folding it and marking with pins. Pull ends of thread to gather basket.



At the sewing machine, stitch binding to basket using a generous quarter inch seam, just a little more than the basting stitches; remove pins as you go along. Then fold binding over to outside and stitch down by hand. (If binding won't cover all the stitches, it may be necessary to trim the raw edges a little.) The basket is actually reversible now, so you can turn it to have either fabric be on the outside.

If desired, make a little handle and stitch or glue it on, perhaps adding buttons or flowers on the ends.

This basket came out 2" tall \times $4\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Make larger or smaller ones with different size circles, adjusting the length of the binding strip as needed.
