Holiday Parties and Block Exchange

Holiday Parties—Bring a dish to share and a block for the Holiday Block Exchange.

There are two parties to reflect the Tuesday Evening (December 13th) and the Wednesday Morning (December 14th) groups.

HOLIDAY BLOCK EXCHANGE 2016

Each Tucson Quilters Guild Member is invited and encouraged to create a Holiday quilt block for the annual Holiday Block Exchange. All you have to do is create a block that is a 12½ by 12½ inch square (finished size 12" x 12").

Then pin a detachable muslin label that has the following information printed on it:

Owned by:	
Title: (optional)	

Roll the block with its label attached around a paper towel tube; gift wrap the package; and bring it to the Holiday Party. At the party, the wrapped blocks will be collected for distribution during the event.

Each member that brings a block gets to choose a wrapped block from the basket. Unwrap your new treasure, write your name on the owned by line, and then pass it in to the Holiday Block Chairperson. All blocks are displayed for the ENTIRE membership to vote for his or her favorite block. The top four blocks of each event will be retained for the January meeting. All other blocks will be taken home by their new owners. In January the FINAL EIGHT will be voted on by the entire membership; the top four blocks will be awarded 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and honorable mention. The winners will be announced at the Quilt Fiesta; ALL EIGHT blocks will be hung in the Quilt Fiesta. The Final Eight will be returned to their new owners at the March meetings; the ribbons will be given to the makers at the March meetings.







Thanks, Mary, we will attempt to make this happen. In most cases, the podium is centered with the microphone attached, so it should be easy enough to do. And we do want you to see us!



By the way, hope you can come to the Holiday potluck meetings in December! I would be surprised if we don't have some kind of get-to-know each other game....



Arizona Quilt Documentation Project - Tucson

At the December documentation meeting, the team welcomed Shellie Whitman. Shellie recently moved to Tucson from Payson where she had been involved with quilt documentation. Shellie agreed to join the Tucson team. Welcome, Shellie!

Sue reviewed the Arizona Quilt Study meeting recently held at the *Arizona History Museum*. A number of the Tucson team attended said meeting. Kate gave an update of the coming Public documentation. Next month there will be many quilts to describe.

Bea Kabler and Linda Laird presented the continuing education for the team. They reviewed a recent workshop they attended at the *International Quilt Study and Center* in Lincoln, Nebraska. They learned about the Turkey red process (it isn't a color); also that the Museum's holdings include 5000 quilts, many from other countries. They had more information to share than time allowed so Linda programmed it and placed it on the computer. Now each team member can access it for a limited time. They also were fortunate in getting a behind the scenes tour of the facility. In addition, Bea shared information on Mountain Mist.

Quilts documented include the following: Bea shared a delightful quilt that she titled *Blue Redwork*. As you might expect, the quilt was comprised of varied whimsical blocks, beautifully embroidered in blue. Another quilt that provided a bit of nostalgia was Linda's *Parasol Girl* quilt. This kit quilt, begun in 1991, was finished in 2005. How many of us can identify with that? I can. Now it will be a lovely wedding gift for Linda's granddaughter.

The third quilt documented, *Victory Star Laced with Churn Dash*, belonged to Sue. This quilt, too, was accomplished over a period of several years. But for Sue, the end result was worth it. She got a first place ribbon in *Quilt Fiesta* when it was shown. Terry brought one of her collector quilts, a circa 1950 blue and white *Drunkard's Path*. That is a timeless favorite. The final quilt documented was a small *Dresden Plate* wall hanging made by Sue for a quilt club challenge a number of years ago. After the large size of her previous quilt, the team was pleased to see this one

Pattern of the Month - December 2016

Tomte's Trees 28" × 24"

A paper pieced quilt with 4" blocks

Last month's pattern was a Little Tree, and as promised, this month's pattern is for a winter wall hanging. The final 4" block is Tomte, a Swedish gnome, possibly a distant relative of Santa. He is the guardian of a family and their land, protecting the homestead and all its creatures. Solitary

and sometimes
mischievous, he lives in the
forest, although he has
been known to hang out in
the barn with the horses.

The gnome in our little quilt is the keeper of a hillside of little trees.



This month's pattern uses 21 Little Trees plus one 4" Tomte block (use the foundation pattern provided on a separate page). For this quilt, you'll need about $1\frac{1}{4}$ yards of background fabric for the quilt top (2 yards if you want to use the same fabric for the back, too), and assorted scraps for the trees. If you've already started making some Little Trees, you have a head start! Please refer back to the November Pattern of the Month for paper piecing directions, and make one more block—Tomte—and arrange him with some trees as shown, or any way you like, filling in with a few plain background squares as needed. Notice that in the quilt shown, every other vertical row begins and ends with a half-drop; this staggers the trees so they look like they are on a hillside.

*(See cutting directions below for measurements of plain squares and half-drop rectangles.)

1-3/8"

Pieces to pre-cut (for Tomte block):

Red (suit and hat)

<u>Background</u>

Cut three $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (A2, A3 and A4)


A5 and A6: Lay <u>two</u> 5" squares of background fabric with <u>right sides together</u> and cut diagonally as shown → (Note: this is a different angle than the Little Tree block)

White (beard)

Separate the right and left pairs; this makes two

Cut one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square For A1

mirror image pairs (you only need one pair per block.)



1-3/8"

Nose

Embroider, draw, or applique at upper edge of beard fabric, either before or after sewing seam A1/A2.

To complete the 6 *vertical* quilt rows as shown, *cut from background fabric: five $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and six $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles (half-drops). Inner border is cut 1" wide (striped fabric to suggest fencing) and outer border cut 2" wide, from background fabric. A piped binding is shown, or use a plain binding.
