Some quilts were made by those of us who have made quilts for years and years and years...and others were made by new quilters and some were made by youngsters. There will be quilts for sale and many for auction. There will be many vendors where you can see and purchase the most amazing items to help you make your next quilt. You'll see quilts that were awarded ribbons in many categories. You will be inspired, you will be in awe of the workmanship, and you will support and encourage the Tucson Quilters Guild family. So come and enjoy the beauty of the quilts and the love that they represent.

Quilt Fiesta Co-Directors:

This is the last newsletter before the Quilt Show. We hope all of the quilts are finished and ready to be turned in. As we mentioned at the January Guild meetings, here are a few important reminders for getting your quilt(s) ready for the show.

- All quilts must have a <u>4 inch sleeve</u> (Category 1100 requires a 3 inch sleeve); the <u>quilt ID label</u> should be <u>sewn</u> to the <u>lower left hand corner of the back of the quilt</u>. Cover your personal label with fabric to allow for anonymity during judging; <u>ID label for the quilt bag</u> should be <u>sewn near the center of the open end</u>. Please do not put your name on the quilt bag.
 - Before you put your quilt into the bag please <u>make sure it is clean and odor free.</u> Use a lint roller on the front and the back to remove, lint, loose threads, and pet hair. If there is a smoker in your household, air out the quilt and the bag; then think about keeping the quilt in a smoke free environment until the show
- 3. Make sure the <u>quilt bag</u> is <u>not too big or too small</u>, no flannel, no Velcro, no zippers, no safety pins, no drawstrings, and no ties. And <u>clean, inside and out</u>. Think lint roller again; little details make a difference.
 - Please fold your quilt top to bottom, then again as needed, so that when placed in the bag both the ID label and sleeve are easily visible at the open end.

 This is a help for those who will be handling your quilt.
- 5. Special Handling requires pre-approval. Please see your Instruction Letter for details.

TURNING IN YOUR QUILTS: All quilts, judged or non-judged, MUST be brought to the February 7th or 8th Guild Meetings. If you are unable to bring your quilt(s), ask a friend or relative to deliver them for you. If you absolutely cannot get your quilt(s) to either of the Guild meetings, call Paulette Worman (if it's a Non-Judged quilt) 520-631-6928 or Karen Kelter (if it is a Judged quilt) 520-319-0326. Unexpected things do happen, but please try to have your quilts delivered to the Guild Meetings.

PICKING UP YOUR QUILTS: You MUST pick up your quilt at the Tucson Convention Center, Sunday, February 19, 2017 after the show, beginning as close to 5:30 pm as is humanly possible. Please be patient...we will be handling almost 306 quilts. For security and safety reasons, no quilts will be released until they have all been taken down, packaged in their cloth bags and organized. Also, all Hardware must be down and safely put away. You must have your Claim check and initial a form indicating that your received your quilt. If you ask a friend or relative to pick up your quilt, that person must have the claim check and initial the form.

Good Things to Remember When Coming to the Quilt Show: Wear comfortable shoes! If you want to put your purse in your trunk, it's safer to do it before you leave home! There will be no place to store your coat or packages.

We would like to thank everyone who generously shared their quilts in the 2017 Quilt Fiesta. And also thank you to everyone who has volunteered to help us, set up the show, take it down and help it run smoothly. It wouldn't be much of a show without your generosity and it is much appreciated.


Take Down:



Rules:


If a name is suggested by a team, the team must decide among themselves who will receive the prize.


PROGRAM NOTES





Braided Hearts - 6" block

This pieced and appliqued quilt block is based on the paper heart baskets woven by Scandinavian school children. It lends itself to several delightful arrangements for red and white quilts. There is no curved piecing, as the curved part of the heart is made using a facing technique; it is then stitched down by hand or machine.



Cutting for one 6" block ($6\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished):

Red - two 3" \times 5" pieces; plus 1 strip $1\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 13"

White - two 3" x 5" pieces; plus 1 strip $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 13"

Red and white print (medium value, for background) – two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square

Trace two copies of heart top template onto plain white paper (tracing both inner stitching line <u>and</u> outer cutting line); cut out roughly, outside the outer lines. Center and pin one paper template on top of the two red fabric rectangles, with their right sides together. Stitch on <u>inner</u> line through all layers, just along the curved part, backstitching at both ends. <u>Leave straight edge open for turning</u>.

Cut on <u>outer</u> line through paper and fabric together. Then, remove

(4 identical blocks ↓)



paper and using pinking shears, trim seam allowance slightly on just the curved edge (or, clip the curved edge). Turn right side out, making a smooth curve; press. Applique by hand or machine to one of the background rectangles, aligning straight raw edges and making sure curved edge is $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from background edges on other 3 sides. Repeat with second paper template and white fabric.

Stitch the red and white $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips together on one long edge, using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance; press toward the red. Cut into eight $1\frac{1}{2}$ " sections. Combine these to make the checkerboard section of the block, alternating red and white as shown in block illustration at top of page.

Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " background square to the right hand end of the red heart top. Join the white heart top to the side of the checkerboard, and join the parts together to make the block, as shown above.
