PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Tucson Quilters,

We watch with sadness and concern the many natural disasters – Houston, Florida, Mexico, and the Caribbean—unfolding around the world. As quilters, our natural instincts are to help those who have lost so much by sending the warmth and comfort of our beautiful quilts. We can also imagine, quite viscerally, the horror our fellow quilters must be feeling at losing their carefully curated collections of fabric, not to mention their sewing machines, rulers, threads, books, and so much else. These may not be their most critical or immediate of losses, but we know they're significant nonetheless.

There has been a lot of discussion over the last few weeks about how best to help, and lots of people are mobilizing in various ways already. You heard from one of our members, Hester Rodgers, at the September meeting about collecting quilting supplies at the November meeting. Folks at The Quilt Basket have been collecting quilts for hurricane relief. At the same time, several of our members with experience in sending quilts for disaster relief have counseled delaying our response so that we can investigate the best avenues for donation and to make sure that whatever we send gets to the right places at the right time. Notices from Hester and from Mary Meserve, Co-chair of the Guild's Quilting for Others committee appear in this newsletter.

Before endorsing any one approach – or, perhaps, several approaches – as a sponsored activity of the Guild, I would like to open the issue for discussion at the next meeting of the Board of Directors and Committee Chairs on October 4th. All Guild members are always welcome at our business meetings, but if you would like to contribute mainly to this discussion, please arrive no later than 10:45am when we will address the question as new business. The meeting takes place in the same room as our library during regular monthly meetings.

So, your quilts will be delivered on Tuesday night, 6 February and Wednesday day, 7 February.


The collection point will be in the Library Room at our usual St Frances Cabrini Church and the hours will be the regular meeting hours.

The deadline for submitting your entries is either October 10th at the evening meeting or October 11th at the daytime meeting. If entering by mail the deadline is October 27th. Fillable Show Entry Form—Step by Step Directions

Here's the "step by step" instructions to use the fillable entry form! Being able to easily read all your information will be a great help to us!

1. Download the "Quilt Show Packet" pdf file from the TQG website. If you don't have access to a computer, let us know. We can have blank forms available for you to fill out the "old fashioned way" at upcoming meetings.

2. Save the form to your computer as "2018 entry".

3. Open it, read the category descriptions (because they've changed)...and just start typing in the shaded areas. There are a few things you'll need to circle later, but your name and address - even the quilt's description! - can be typed in!

4. After filling in everything you can, save this as "2018 entry 1". That will preserve the original blank version so you can use it again for additional quilts.

5. If you have another quilt, you can either open the blank "2018 entry" again and type in the information on your second quilt and save it as "2018 entry 2", etc. OR you can download the "Quilt Show Entry Form alone" pdf file and fill it out and save it.

6. When you want to print out and complete your forms you only need to print out pages 3 and 4 of the Packet (the form itself). If you've also downloaded the "Entry Form alone" file as well, print out the complete file after filling it in.

7. Go over the filled-in forms for each of your quilts and circle what needs to be circled, and sign them.


8. Attach your photos and your check. Bring to a Guild meeting or mail it in!

NOTE: There's some confusion about the fees. It is \$1 for YOU to enter up to 3 quilts. If you want any of your quilts judged, each one costs \$5. If you enter 3 quilts and want them all judged, your fee will be \$1 + \$15 for the judging - totaling \$16.

Donating a Small Quilt


Donating a quilt to the Small Quilt Auction is fun and easy. The only requirement is the maximum perimeter size is 100 inches.

Quilt Fiesta and the *Vintage Quilt Turning*! **Ruby**! It doesn't matter if the quilt has been in a previous quilt turning. Red and white is all that counts. Quilts from 1950 and older are acceptable.

Carrie Hall noted in *The Patchwork Quilt* that "Of all the things a woman's hands have made, the quilt so lightly thrown across the bed--- the quilt that keeps her loved ones warm---Is woven of her dreams and thread." The patchwork of red and white, as well as the lovely redwork quilts you may have, are good examples of quilts that were filled with the dreams of the maker for the beloved recipient.

PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE 2018

Theme: "Let the Sunshine In"

Rules:

- Interpret the theme any way you want e.g., a break in the clouds, broken window blinds, tie-dyed t-shirts. Just, in some way that viewers will be able to identify, when told the theme, your quilt must evoke the theme of "Let the Sunshine In."
- 2. The quilt should measure no more than 100 inches around the perimeter. Any rectangular shape of that dimension is acceptable. If your quilt is not rectangular, make sure that it will fit in a rectangle that is no more than 100 inches around the perimeter.
- 3. All techniques (e.g., piecing, appliqué, whole cloth) and all genres (e.g., modern, civil war, barn sampler) are welcome.
- 4. The quilt must have a hanging sleeve and a label containing the quilt maker's name and title of the quilt. Additional information on the label is fine. Quilts must also be contained in a cloth bag to protect them from dirt or damage.
- 5. President's Challenge quilts are due by the November meetings. Each quilt must be accompanied by an entry form, included below and available on the TQG website. We will display the quilts and conduct a first vote at the November meetings. Top vote getters from both the evening and daytime meetings will be displayed again and voted on for final winners at the January meeting.
- 6. Winning quilts will be displayed at the quilt show and returned at the end of the show.





Arizona Quilt Documentation Project – Tucson

In September, the team finished documenting team member, Bea Kabler's Hopi quilts. Other Hopi quilts documented belonged to team photographer, Peggy Hazard. Bea also brought a change of pace for the team, her *Mimbres Queen* quilt.



Now, let's review the quilts. Bea's quilts will be covered first. 1) A *Mud Hen Katsinas*, a lovely four block quilt with identical rust colored mud hens on white ground. The blocks, framed in black, were hand painted by Bonnie Nampeyo Chapella, Corn Clan. 2) *Hopi Pottery* Blocks, hand painted by Bonnie Nampeyo. Bonnie used her Great, Great Grandmother's pottery blocks for the design for this four block quilt encased in shades of brown. 3) Another *Hopi Pottery* four block, again hand painted. This one separated by either salmon or gold print sashing or blue print and red or salmon sashing. It has short saw tooth borders on sides; strips, picking up the colors of the sashing, on the quilt's top and bottom. 4) Bea's last *Hopi Pottery* block is rectangular with three hand painted blocks separated by sashings of green with pieced rectangles between. Saw tooth borders on each side. Warm brown shades predominate on this quilt. Bea brought another quilt that she hand pieced and then had hand quilted; her *Mimbres Queen* treasure. This quilt, done in turquoise, black and cream is Bea's daughter's favorite.

Peggy's first also is a Hopi 1) *Long Hair Kachina Paintings* with windmills in yellow, turquoise, purple, and bright pink. 2) The next, a *One Patch* Hopi is made of corduroy with a flannel back. The tied quilt is made from greens, blues, and browns and looking at it from a distance, one can imagine butterfly wings. 3) Peggy's last quilt, *Hopi Scrappy Sampler*, contains a wealth of vintage fabrics. Red ties hold this gem together.

 Pattern of the Month - October 2017 "Autumn Rush"

 --part 2, add some Leaves!

Here's another block using Triangle Squares. Start by making some assorted scrappy light/dark Triangle Squares *(Please refer to directions in the September 2017 pattern, Autumn Rush – part 1),* then follow cutting and block directions below, to quickly make a 9-patch Autumn Leaf block that comes out the same size as your Autumn


Rush blocks ($9\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished; 9" finished). Make a bunch of pretty leaves to scatter into your quilt, too! Here's how:

For each Autumn Leaf Block:

Make 4 assorted light/dark Triangle Squares (measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ ")

Cut 5 $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares - (3 of assorted darker leaf colors and 2 of the background fabric) Arrange into 3 rows as shown, with the 2 background squares positioned at opposite corners, and remaining squares and light/ dark triangles oriented as shown, right, \rightarrow

to make the leaf shape. Sew into rows. Press row seams in opposite directions. Then stitch rows together to make the 9-patch Autumn Leaf Block.



Autumn Leaf Block






Table Runner 24" x 78" with 3" borders 15 Rush blocks (2 colors) (row on left has a half-drop)

September/October 2017 POM Quilt Ideas Using Autumn Rush and Leaf Blocks
