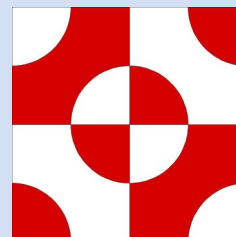

# 2018 Quilt Fiesta!

## Quilt Fiesta Co-Directors:

Well, here we are, down to the wire, just days before the show.

Are you having your quilt(s) judged? A few reminders for everyone:

\* After you've finished your quilt, please air it out. Hanging in a shady spot will take away any odors such as smoking, pets, cooking, etc. **DO NOT USE FEBREZE OR LIKE PRODUCT TO MASK ODORS.**

Rationale:

1. Sometimes a judge will be allergic to smoke, perfumes etc.; not a pretty sight!
2. If you have any odor or debris it can transfer to a fellow quilter's work.

\* Run a lint roller over your quilt, back and front, to get rid of any pet hairs, loose threads, etc. You may need to use several papers. Quilts are no longer being cleaned by the helpers at judging. There are sheets used to isolate the offending quilt. Thus, the judges will see the condition and it will be marked down accordingly. For non-judged quilts, our guests will observe it.

\* Place the quilt in a pillow case after you've used a lint roller on the inside of the case.  
- Quilt must be folded with quilt label showing as you open the case.  
- Show label centered on pillow case also. This is to make it easier for the judging helpers who are working with over 200 judged quilts this year. Also, even for non-judged quilts, when we hang them it makes it so much easier to get them in the right spot.

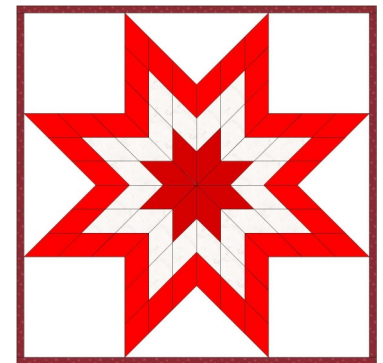
\* For those being judged, if you have a personal label, can you please cover it? It doesn't need to be fancy, just a piece of fabric basted over the label. It helps at judging if we don't have to mask the label with painter's tape. No names are allowed to show during judging.

\* There has been an inquiry about what the judges are looking for. At this point it's too late as I'm sure your quilts are way past the stage where you can make any corrections. But, it is a good idea to address this inquiry and I'll make sure it gets into a future newsletter!

Thanks to all 393 of you who entered a quilt for our 40th Anniversary of the show! And bless you all for responding to the Red & White Challenge! We love it when a plan comes together!

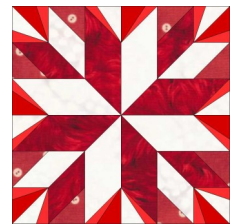
Dear Members,

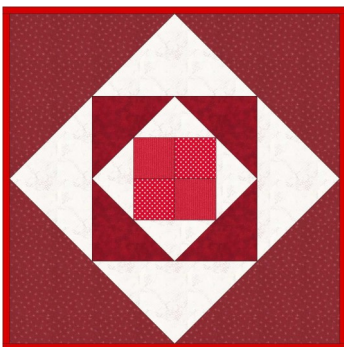

**Thank you to all who donated one or more small quilts or 'Lamentables' to the Small Quilt Auction.** We have been amazed by your quilts - and your generosity.

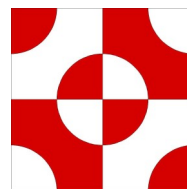
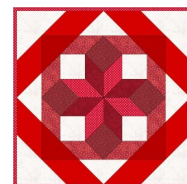
Proceeds from this year's auction will be split between **Literacy Connects** and it's subsidiary **Reading Seed**. **Literacy Connects** is a Tucson-based nonprofit founded in July 2011 through the merger of five literacy organizations (including Reading Seed). From birth throughout adulthood, Literacy Connects' programs offer opportunities for learners of all ages to realize their potential. Last year, the Literacy Connects staff and more than 1,500 dedicated volunteers helped more than 50,000 individuals in Southern Arizona. **Reading Seed** recruits and trains volunteer reading coaches to work one-on-one with students in kindergarten through third grade who are reading below grade level. 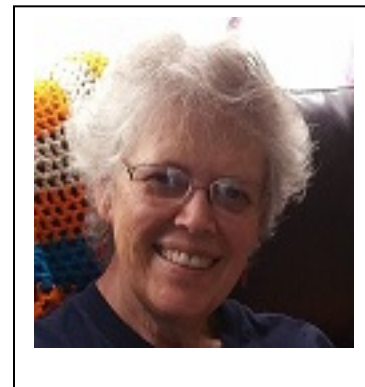

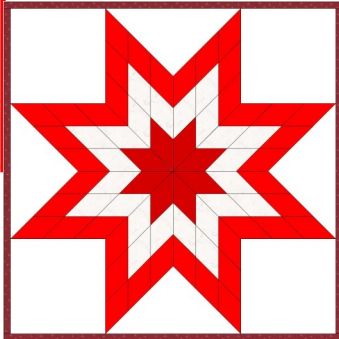

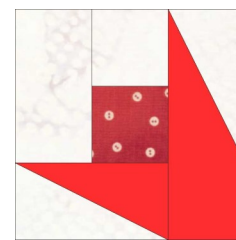
