### ARIZONA QUILT DOCUMENTATION PROJECT

Tucson Region,

The team met in January and welcomed two new members, Eileen Fairbanks and Mega Fairchild. Terry G-W noted she would speak at the Arizona Quilt Study Group meeting, March 14, to be held in Sun City, Phoenix. She will discuss and show her many vintage quilts with attendees; more details will be announced as available.

Sue reviewed key things she noted after her review of the 24 documents from the November 9th Public Documentation. This task is done after each meeting as well as following the public documentations. Her advice to team members consistently, is to "go line by line" and not to skip around the pages; the best way to avoid errors.

She also provided the continuing education talk, The Quilts of Red and Green. Following that, she circulated a sheet of potential continuing education topics with a place for team members to indicate a topic and date when they would like to do their choice. Additional topics could be added.

Quilts documented were: 1) Crossed Tulips; Sandy Woods 2) Grandmother's Flower Garden; Bea Kabler 3) Grandmother's Flower Garden; Bea Kabler and 4) Regal Lily Variation with Center Circle Added; a circa 1850 quilt owned by Nancy Landon. Both Nancy's and Sandy's quilts provided good examples of the continuing ed topic; Quilts of Red and Green. Sue also provided several, including a couple Baltimore Album examples.

The next meeting will be February 10th at Ellie Towne Community Center at 1660 West Ruthrauff Road. The next Public Documentation will be March 21st at the Arizona History Museum on 2nd Street. Friends are volunteers that help at various events, or handle various other jobs. We are especially looking for someone that would be interested in working on the Quilt for a Cause scrapbooks, and for a photographer that can shoot Quilt for a Cause events. Come join the fun!

# Pattern of the Month

## December 2019

### **“Name Tag/Pouch”**

A Design by Val M. Hintze

#### **Supplies:**

Medium Weight Clear Plastic Rectangle (3"x4")  
 Double-Sided Tape  
 Gross Grain Ribbon ½" wide  
 Small Plastic Rings (optional)

#### **Fabric Requirements:**

Outer Bag: Cut two pieces 7" W x 8.5" L  
 Lining: Cut two pieces 7" W x 8.5" L  
 Optional iron-on interfacing: Cut two pcs 7" W x 8.5" L  
 Pouch Strap: One piece of Ribbon 38" L

#### **Instructions:**

##### **Step One: Framing the Plastic Window**

1. Cut out a 3"x4" piece of medium weight clear plastic (such as the type used for report covers.)
2. Use ½" wide Gross Grain Ribbon to frame the plastic window. Cut two pieces 4" long each for top and bottom, and two pieces 5" long each for the sides.
3. Use double-sided tape to adhere ribbon to sides of the plastic window. Tape is difficult to manage and works best by tearing off 1" pieces, then cut the pieces in half, lengthwise, to fit the center length of ribbon.
4. Align 4" long ribbons with edges of top and bottom of window. Set sewing machine for 2.5 or 3, top stitch (only one side) down middle of the ribbon. This side is now the top of the window.
5. Frame short sides of window with 5" pcs of ribbon using the extra length to overlap each end at the corners.
6. Apply narrow strips of tape to the back of only three sides (you should have already stitched the top of the window.)

##### **Step Two: Making the Pouch**

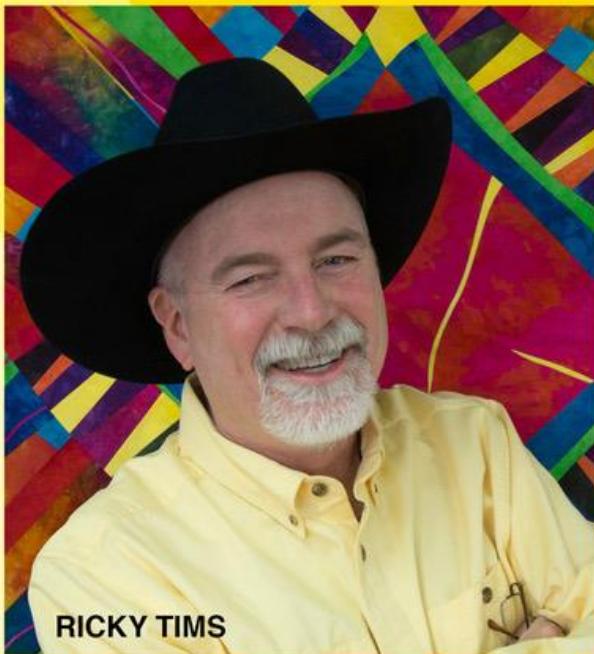
1. Place framed window on right side of one of the 7" x 8.5" outer bag fabrics. Center the framed window at the bottom. Tape should already be on back of the window. With the machine set at 2.5 or 3, top stitch the sides and bottom in the center of the ribbon. This finishes the window.
2. Sew outer fabric pieces, front and back, right sides together along the sides and bottom. Turn right side out through top opening. Turn top edge under ½" and press.
3. Follow the steps as in B above to sew lining fabric.
4. With turned under raw edges of outer fabric and lining, pin, then top stitch around the opening.

##### **Step Three: Making the Pouch Strap**

There are many ways to add straps to totes, bags, and pouches. I used gross grain ribbon and sewed each end to a small plastic ring, and hand stitched the rings to the inner seam side of the pouch. Please use the method you are most familiar or comfortable with.
