Framed 4-Patch Kid's Quilt 40" x 53" (13" blocks)

Fabric:

5" Novelty squares (24 matched pairs, or 48 assorted) ½ yard Red (or 7 2½" x WOF strips) ½ yard Blue (or 7 2½" x WOF strips) 3/8 yard for binding (5 2½" x WOF strips) 1½ yards backing

Make twelve 4-patches with the 5" Novelty squares.


From the strips of Red and Blue:


Cut 3 strips of each color into 9½" pieces (need 12 Red and 12 Blue). Cut 4 strips of each color into 13½" pieces (need 12 Red and 12 Blue).

Frame six of the 4-patches in Red, and six in Blue, as illustrated below.

For the Red frames (below, left): first sew 9½" pieces to left and right sides, then sew 13½" pieces to top and bottom.

For the Blue frames (below, right): first sew 9½" pieces to top and bottom, then sew 13½" pieces to sides. (This way, there are no extra seams to match when joining the blocks into rows.)





Alternate the Red and Blue framed blocks in rows and sew together to make the quilt top.

No borders are needed (but could be added if a bigger quilt is desired; however, additional backing would be needed if quilt is bigger). The quilt as shown, without borders, uses one WOF for backing, without piecing.
